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Homemade Halloween Decor

DIY Wreath for Halloween



Give your home a festive touch this fall with this DIY Wreath for Halloween. Black, orange, and purple yarn are all used to crochet a ribbon that you wrap around a metal wire wreath frame; pumpkin decorations and black flowers are added for extra decor. Create the "boo" letters with cardboard and black yarn. This wreath design is super simple to create and will definitely make your house stand apart from the rest this season.

Materials:

- Worsted Weight Yarn in black, purple and orange
- Crochet Hook: 6.0 mm
18-inch wire wreath frame
2 black flowers
Pumpkin decorations (from the floral section of your local craft store)

Skill Level: Easy

Size:

18 inch diameter because of wreath frame

Instructions:

Crochet Ribbon Pattern:

Note: Depending on your gauge and style, your ribbon might be **longer** or shorter than you need. If it's just a little too short, you can unwind it then rewind it tighter. If it's too long, wind it more loosely, then tuck in the extra on the back.

Chain 130 with the black yarn.

Row 1: In the 2nd chain from the hook, work 1 half double crochet. Work 1 half double crochet in each stitch all the way down. Fasten off.

Row 2: Attach purple to the end of the **previous** chain with a slip stitch and a chain **1**. Work 1 hdc in each stitch all the way down.

Rows 3-7: Work exactly like row two, **changing** colors in each row. (orange, black, **purple**, orange, black).

Then, you'll take the ribbon and wrap it around the frame like the picture demonstrates.



You'll then need some wire cutters to cut off the flower stems. Stick them into the stitches so it's nice and secure. Then, take the pumpkins or other decorations and fill in above the flowers. Now, it's secure enough to hang on the door, but when you go to store it the decorations may fall off of it. However, this helps make sure that the flowers won't get squished.



To make the letters, you can take a cereal box and draw letters onto it and cut them out. If you don't trust yourself to draw the letters (smile), just print them out on a piece of paper, cut them out and trace them onto cardboard.



Then, cut off a bunch of yarn and form it into a small ball, then start wrapping the letters with the yarn.

Note: This is the tedious part! Don't make the mistake of not making a ball out of the yarn and spending most of your time untangling it as it's wrapped. It looks better when you wrap the letters several times. The letters do look fuzzy and a little wonky, but that's kind of the look you want for Halloween anyway.



Boo Coasters



You can never have too many crocheted coasters, especially during the holiday season. Make a set of these festive Boo Coasters to use during the Halloween season. This is one free crochet pattern that the whole family is sure to enjoy. They're great for everyday use during October, or for special occasions such as Halloween parties, scary movie marathons, or pumpkin carving get-togethers.

Materials:

- Worsted Weight Yarn
- Crochet Hook: 6.0 mm
- Yarn Needle
- Felt for Backing (optional)

Size: 4" wide x 4 ¼" high

Gauge: 4 sc = 1 inch

Notes:

1. Following Color Charts: When following a color chart, each **square** represents one sc. Work all odd numbered rows by following the chart from right to left and work all even numbered rows by following the chart from left to right. Ch 1, turn at the end of each row.

2. Changing Colors: To change colors: when completing the stitch **prior** to the start of a new color, complete the stitch through until the last yo (yarn over). On the last yo, pick up new color, yo and pull through loops to complete stitch. You now have the new color on the hook and are ready to continue stitching.

3. Using Row Count Instructions: To use row counts, the number of stitches is followed by the color abbreviation. For example: Row 3 for the "B" coaster reads 4O, 5B, 4O. This means with orange, sc in the first 4 stitches, change to black and sc in next 5 stitches, change to orange and sc in last 3 sts. Ch 1, turn at the end of each row.

Instructions:

Color Chart Symbols:



= 1 sc Orange



= 1 sc Black

“B” Coaster:

Row 1: With orange, ch 13, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, ch 1, **turn** (12 sc)

Rows 2 – 14: Follow either color chart or row count instructions. End off, weave **in** ends.

Row 13) 12O, ch 1, turn

Row 14) 12O, End off, weave in ends.

“O” Coaster: (Make 2)

Note: When making the second “O” coaster, use same instructions **below**, but switch the colors, and use orange as the background color and black for the letter.

Row 1: With black, ch 13, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, ch 1, turn (12 sc)

Rows 2 – 14: Follow either color chart or row count instructions. End off, weave in ends.

Row 14) 12B, End off, weave in ends.

Border:

With black, join with a sl st in any stitch (I like to start at the bottom center), sc in same st as joining, *change to orange, sc in next st, change to black, sc in next st*, repeat from * to * around, working a sc in each stitch, with 3 sc in each corner. You will be changing colors on every stitch (including the 3 sc sts in each corner) to get the checkered border. After stitching the last orange sc, change to black, and join with sl st to beg sc. End off, weave in ends. **Note:** You can also work the border in just one color, just sc in each st around, with 3 sc in each corner.

Optional Finishing:

If desired, the back can be covered with a small piece of felt. Cut a square piece of felt 3 ½" x 3 ¾" (or ½" smaller than your coaster). Trim each corner to round off, and using sewing thread and needle, whipstitch felt piece to back of coaster.

Spooky Spiders



Don't let the name scare you off; these Spooky Spiders are actually quite cute. Break away from the traditional black and orange color combination and use multicolored colored yarn instead. These cute spiders are fun to place around your house during Halloween; you could even string them together and hang them from the mantle. Pipe cleaners are used to make the creepy, crawly legs. For a more traditional and spooky look, make them all black instead of multicolored.

Materials:

- Worsted Weight Yarn
 - Model is stitched with Red(ish), Lime(ish), Hot Pink(ish), Magenta(ish), Lime(ish), Black(ish)
- Crochet Hooks: 3.5 mm and 6.0 mm
Black Safety Eyes (6mm)
Polyester Stuffing
Yarn Needle
Embroidery Needle
Black Embroidery Floss
Pipe Cleaners (Model uses silver)

Skill Level: Easy

Instructions:

Spider:

Starting at top of head, make an adjustable ring, ch 1, and sc 6 into the ring. Pull closed.

Rnd 1: Work 2 sc into each st (12)

Rnd 2: (2 Sc into next st, sc into next st)* rep to end of round (18)

Rnd 3: (2 Sc into next st, sc into next 2 st)* rep to end of round (24)

Rnds 4-5: sc into each st (24)

Rnd 6: (Sc2tog, sc into next 2 st)* rep to **end** of round (18)

Rnd 7: (Sc2tog, sc into next st)* rep to end **of** round (12)

*Insert safety eyes and stuff spider firmly.

Rnd 8: Sc2tog around (6)

Fasten off. Use yarn tail to sew opening closed.



Using embroidery needle and black embroidery floss, embroider a "v" shape with loose stitches where the mouth belongs. Loose stitches will make the smile curve. Knot the floss and hide within the body.

Insert pipe cleaners through last rows of body.



Cut pipe cleaners in half. The standard length of a pipe cleaner is 12", so just make sure you have four 6" lengths (two pipe cleaners) for each spider. Insert each half pipe cleaner through the bottom of the spider's body and out through the other side. Bend the pipe cleaners as shown above.

Web:

With Black(ish) yarn and a G hook, crochet a chain long enough to drape across the area you wish to hang your String of Spiders. I hung mine on the mantle and chained 275 stitches. Fasten off and set aside.

ASSEMBLY

With Black(ish) and a yarn needle, thread varying lengths of yarn into the tops of the Spiders' bodies. Knot close to the surface and pull tail to pull knot inside. Tie the other end of the yarn to the Web. Space the spiders evenly across its length. Hang as desired.

*If the spiders are to be given to children as toys, please omit the safety eyes and embroider them, and use strands of yarn for the legs instead of pipe cleaners.



Trio of Halloween Cozies



Choose any one of these adorable holiday crochet patterns to use this fall. The Trio of Halloween Cozies includes the cutest monsters and ghouls you've ever seen. Let the Jack-o-Lantern, Frankenstein, or Ghostie keep your coffee warm and your fingers protected as you hand out Halloween candy this year. They are all so cute; you won't be able to pick just one. Work up all of them as decorations on your candy table and so everyone in the family can have one for themselves. What a creative way to be festive this Halloween!

Materials:

- Worsted Weight Yarn
 - For Jack-O-Lantern: INSCRAFT: Tangerine A, Black B and White C.
 - For Frankenstein: INSCRAFT: Leaf D, Black B, Red E and White C.
 - For Ghostie: INSCRAFT: White C and Black B.

Crochet Hook: 6.0 mm

Yarn Needle

Skill Level: Easy

Size: Cozy stretches to fit most sizes of coffee shop cups.

Gauge: 24 sts = 5" (13 cm); 17 rows = 4" (10 cm) in sc.

Instructions:

COZY:

With A for Jack-O-Lantern, D for Frankenstein or C for Ghostie, ch 13.

Row 1 (Right Side): Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn – 12 sc.

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in back loop only of each **sc** across, turn.

Repeat Row 2 until piece measures 8" (20 cm) from beginning, end with a wrong side row. Do NOT fasten off.

Joining Row: With wrong side facing and **short** edges aligned and working through **top** of last row and remaining loop of foundation ch, ch 1, slip st in each st across. Fasten off.

FINISHING:

JACK-O-LANTERN

EYES (Make 2)

With B, ch 4. Row 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hook, hdc in next ch, dc in last ch.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.

Sew Eyes to front of Cozy. With C, embroider a small highlight in each Eye.

MOUTH

With B, ch 13.

Row 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hook, hdc in next ch, dc in each of next 8 ch, hdc in next ch, sc in last sc.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing. Curve Mouth into a smile and sew in place.

FRANKENSTEIN:

NOSE

With D, ch 2.

Round 1: Work 4 sc in 2nd ch from hook, slip st in first sc to join.

Round 2: Ch 1, sc in back loop of each sc around, slip st in first sc.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.

Sew Nose to center front of Cozy.

EAR (Make 2)

With D, ch 4.

Row 1: Work 6 dc in 4th ch from hook. Fasten off, leaving long tail **for** sewing.

Sew one Ear to each side of Cozy.

EYE (Make 2)

With B, ch 2.

Round 1: Work 5 sc in 2nd ch from hook, slip st in first sc to join.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing. Sew Eyes to front of Cozy.
With C, embroider a highlight in each eye.

MOUTH

With E, ch 17.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.

Tack chain to Cozy in a crooked “W” shape for Mouth.

HAIR

Cut 1” (3 cm) lengths of B and attach to center top of Cozy. Trim to ½” (2 cm) for Hair.

GHOSTIE

EYE (Make 2)

Work as for Frankenstein Eye.

MOUTH

With B, ch 4.

Round 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in next ch, 3 sc in next ch, turn to work along opposite side of foundation ch, sc in next ch, 2 sc in next ch, slip st to first sc to join.

Fasten off, leaving a 12” (30 cm) end long tail for sewing.

Sew Mouth to Cozy centered under Eyes.

Weave in ends.

Halloween Costume Ideas

Fun Dragon Hat



Your kids will just love this fun dragon hat. They can wear it to school for show and tell or have an awesome addition to their homemade Halloween costume this year. They will want to be a dragon every single year as long as they get to wear this hat, all because of how fun and exciting it is! Make this perfect dragon hat for your son so that he can have one of the best DIY Halloween costumes this year.

Materials:

- Worsted Weight Yarn
 - Model is stitched with INSCRAFT Super Saver1 skein
 - each: ○ A: Spring Green
 - B: Pumpkin
 - C: Bright Yellow
- Crochet Hook: 6.0 mm
Polyfill Stuffing
Yarn Needle

Skill Level: Intermediate

Size: Hat measures 18" in circumference. Fits Child's size 2-4 years.

Gauge: 5 dc = 1½"; 3 Rounds dc = 1½".

Special Stitch:

sc2tog: [Draw up a loop in next st] twice, **yo** and draw through all 3 loops on hook.

Instructions:

Hat:

Beginning at top of hat with A, ch 4; join into a ring with slip st in first ch.

Round 1: Ch 3 (counts as dc here and throughout), 11 dc in ring; join with a slip st in top of beginning ch 3 – 12 dc.

Round 2: Ch 3, dc in first st, 2 dc in each dc around; join with a slip st in top of **beginning** ch 3 – 24 dc.

Round 3: Ch 3, 2 dc in next dc, *dc in next dc, 2 dc in next dc; repeat from * around, join with a slip st in top of beginning ch 3 – 36 dc.

Round 4: Ch 3, dc in next dc, 2 dc in next dc, *dc in next 2 dc, 2 dc in next dc; repeat from * around, join with a slip st in top of beginning ch 3 – 48 dc.

Round 5: Ch 3, dc in next 2 dc, 2 dc in next dc, *dc in next 3 dc, 2 dc in next dc; repeat from * around, join with a slip st in top of beginning ch 3 – 60 dc.

Rounds 6-13: Ch 3, dc in each dc around, join with a slip st in top of beginning ch 3.

Round 14: Ch 1, sc in same st as joining, *skip 2 dc, 5 sc in next **dc**, skip 2 dc, sc in next dc, repeat from * around, join with a slip st in top of beginning ch 3. Fasten off.

Hat Scales (Make 2):

With B, ch 43.

Row 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hook and each ch across, turn –42 sc.

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in next 6 sc, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, sc2tog over next 2 sc, sc in next 2 sc, sc2tog over next **2** sc, turn.

Row 4: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

Row 5: Ch 1, [sc2tog over next 2 sc] twice, turn.

Row 6: Ch 1, sc2tog over next 2 sc, work 4 sc evenly spaced down **side** of scale.

Row 7: Sc in next 6 sc in Row 1.

Repeat Rows 3-7 (5 times); then repeat Rows 3-6 once, turn.

Joining Row: With wrong sides of hat scales together, ch 1, working through double thickness, sc evenly across top of scales, working 3 sc in top of each scale, leaving bottom open. Stuff each scale very lightly then sew scales in place on top of hat.

Tail:

With A, ch 2.

Round 1: 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook, do not **join**. Work in a spiral, marking beginning of each round, moving marker up as work progresses.

Round 2: Sc in each sc around.

Round 3: *Sc in next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc; **repeat** from * around – 8 sc.

Round 4: *Sc in next 3 sc, 2 sc in next sc; **repeat** from * around – 10 sc.

Round 5: *Sc in next 4 sc, 2 sc in next sc; **repeat** from * around – 12 sc.

Round 6: Sc in each sc around.

Round 7: *Sc in next 3 sc, 2 sc in next sc; repeat from * around – 15 sc.

Rounds 8-9: Sc in each sc around.

Round 10: *Sc in next 4 sc, 2 sc in next sc; repeat from * around – 18 sc.

Rounds 11-12: Sc in each sc around.

Round 13: *Sc in next 5 sc, 2 sc in next sc; repeat from * around – 21 sc.

Rounds 14-27: Sc in each sc around. Fasten off.

Tail Scales:

With B, ch 26.

Row 1: Slip st in 2nd ch from hook, ch 1, *3 dc in next ch, skip next ch, slip st in next ch**, ch 1; repeat from * across, ending last repeat at **. Fasten off. Sew to top center of tail. Stuff tail and sew in place.

Large Spot (Make 2):

With C, ch 2.

Round 1: 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook, do not join, work in a spiral as **before**.

Round 2: 2 sc in each sc around – 12 sc.

Round 3: *Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc; repeat from * around – 18 sc.

Round 4: *Sc in next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc; repeat from * around – **24** sc. Fasten off, leaving long sewing length.

Medium Spot (Make 4):

Work same as Large Spot through Round 3. Fasten off, leaving long sewing length.

Small Spot (Make 2):

Work same as Large Spot through Round 2. Fasten off, leaving long sewing length. Randomly arrange spots on each side of hat and sew in place.

Princess Tiara



Let your little girl's dream of being a princess come true with this free crochet pattern. Princesses are one of the most popular Halloween costume ideas among girls, so the Pretty Princess Tiara is the perfect crochet pattern to make this year. It's quick to work up using only one skein of yarn, and adjustable fastenings make it comfortable to wear. Only a single skein of worsted weight yarn is needed to complete this crochet pattern. Pink craft beads are used as rhinestones, and they add the perfect finishing touch.

Materials:

- Worsted Weight Yarn
 - o Model is stitched with INSCRAFT Super Saver: 1 skein Bright Yellow
- Crochet Hook : 6.0 mm
Stitch-Lock markers
Pink ¼" [0.6 cm] diameter craft beads
3" [8 cm] length of 5/8" [1.6 cm] sew-on Velcro®
Sewing Needle and Thread to match yarn
Yarn Needle

Skill Level: Easy

Size: Crown measures 4" [10 cm] high and will fit up to 20" [50 cm] **circumference.**

Gauge: 13 sts = 4" [10 cm]; 18 rows = 4¼" [11 cm] in sc.

Special Abbreviations:

sc2tog = draw up a loop in next 2 sts, yarn **over** and draw through all 3 loops on **hook**.

Bead-picot = ch 1, slide bead up to hook, **ch** 1, enclosing bead, ch 1, insert hook **under** front loop and vertical bar of last sc, pull yarn through all loops.

Instructions:

Crown:

Ch 72.

Row 1 (Wrong Side): Sc in 2nd ch and each **ch** across; turn – 71 sc.

Rows 2 and 3: Ch 1, sc in each sc across; **turn**.

Row 4: Slip st in 26 sc, ch 1, sc2tog in same and next sc, sc in next 18 sc, sc2tog; **turn** leaving remaining sts unworked – 20 sc.

Rows 5-12: Ch 1, sc2tog over first 2 sc, sc across to last 2 sc, sc2tog over last 2 sc; **turn** – 4 sc at end of Row 12.

Row 13: Ch 1, [sc2tog over next 2 sc] twice; turn – 2 sc.

Row 14: Ch 1, sc2tog – 1 sc. Fasten off.

Edging:

Place marker in tip of point; starting at marker, place a marker every 1½" [4 cm] along both sides of triangle and along top of band. String beads onto yarn with yarn needle.

Row 1: With right side facing, join yarn with slip st to first slip st of Row 4, ch 1, * sc evenly to next marker, sc in marked st, bead-picot **; repeat from * to point of triangle, (2 sc, bead-picot, sc) all in point; repeat from * to end of band, end at **; sc to end of band. Fasten off.

FINISHING

Weave in ends. Using sew-on Velcro strips, sewing needle, and thread to match yarn, stitch a 3" [8 cm] strip of Velcro to each end of band, facing each other, to close back of crown.

Crochet Candy Bar Clutch



Kids are not the only ones that have fun on Halloween. You deserve to work something up that is useful for you, too! Try this Crochet Candy Bar Clutch to keep all the essentials in while you run around the neighborhood collecting candy with your kids. These little pouches are great as pencil cases as well, and would be a fun gift to give your child's teacher during the Halloween season. Make one, or make all three and give a few away. These are so easy to work up, you will want to make as many as you can.

Crochet Hook: 6.0 mm

Yarn Weight(4)Weight/Worsted Weight and Aran (16-20 stitches to 4 inches)

Materials List

Crochet Hook: 6.0mm, or whatever size needed to obtain gauge
For TRICKS in gold:

1. MC – Mustard
 2. CC – White – approx. 20 yards
 3. AC –Black – approx. 10 yards
- For TREATS in orange:
 1. MC – Pupmkin – 1 skein
 2. CC & AC – Chocolate – approx. 30 yards
 - For SWEETS in dark brown:
 1. Main Color (MC) – Espresso
 2. Contrast Color (CC) –White – approx. 20 yards

3. Accent Color (AC) – Scarlet – approx. 10 yards

scissors or yarn cutter

tapestry needle for weaving in ends

felt for cutting out letters: red for Tricks, yellow for Treats, navy blue for Sweets

Fabri-Tac fabric glue

9-inch zipper in the same color as MC

about a dozen straight pins

optional: disappearing ink pen for fabric, needle and thread in a color that matches your felt letters to stitch around them securely

Gauge

15 sc x 19 rows = 4 inches x 4 inches

Finished Size

Approx 4.5 inches x 11 inches

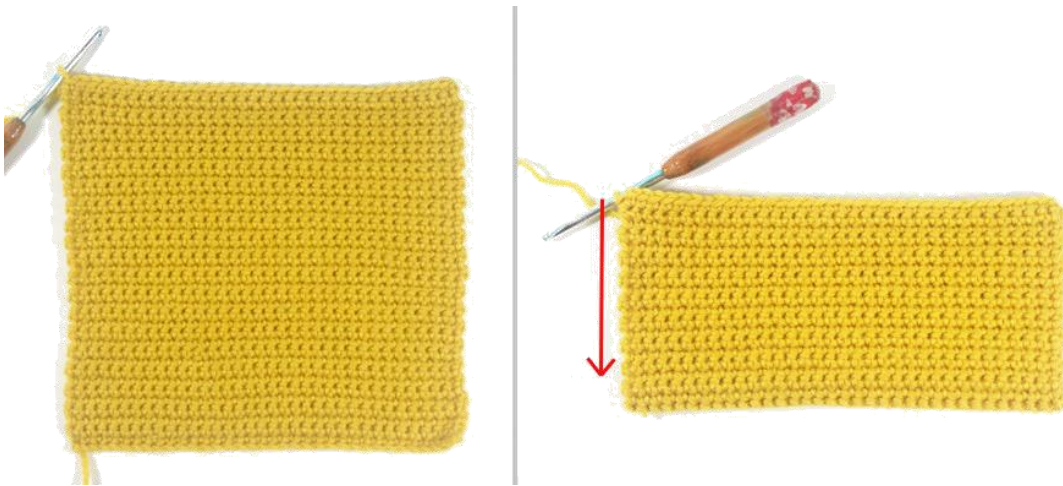
Clutch

– With MC, ch 35.

Row 1: Sk 1st ch and sc evenly across. (34)

Rows 2- 39: Ch 1, turn. Sc evenly across. (34)

– Fold your completed rectangle in half, making Row 39 line up with Row 1. You'll now crochet the side of the Clutch closed while also creating a candy-wrapper-like border. (Photo 1)



Row 40: Ch 1 and sc the side of the Clutch together. Work 19 sc evenly across. (19)

Row 41: Ch 1, turn. Sc evenly across. (19)

Row 42: Ch 1, turn. (RS) [Sk 1, in the next st work (sc, dc, ch 1, dc, sc), sk 1, sl st] 4 times. Sk 1, in the next st work (sc, dc, ch 1, dc, sc), sl st in the last st. Break off.

– Now you will crochet the other side of the Clutch closed.

– With RS facing you, insert hook into the edge of the opening and join MC. (Photo 2)



Rows 1-3: Repeat Rows 40-42 as above.

– Weave in all ends.

Wrist Strap (optional)

– With MC, ch 51.

Row 1: sk 1st ch and sc evenly across. (50) Break off leaving 12 inches of yarn for sewing.

Label

– With CC, ch 27.

Row 1: Sk 1st ch and sc evenly across. (26)

Rows 2-11: Ch 1, turn. Sc evenly across. (26)

– Break off CC and join AC (or if you don't want a border with a different color, just keep using CC).

Rnd 1: Ch 1, turn. Work 25 sc evenly. In the last st, work 3 sc to turn the corner. 8 sc evenly across the edge of the Label. In the last st, work 3 sc to turn the corner. Along the bottom edge, work 26 sc evenly across. Work 3 sc into the 1st st of the last edge, then work 8 more sc evenly across. You should now be back at the first sc of Rnd 1. Work 2 more sc in that st to turn the corner. Sl st to the 1st sc to join. Break off leaving 1 arm-length of yarn for sewing and sew in remaining ends.

Assembly

1. If you want to include Wrist Strap, weave in the short yarn end and then fold Wrist Strap in half to form a loop. With the long yarn end, sew the ends of Wrist Strap together, making sure you sew through about 3 sc-lengths worth. Then tuck the ends of Wrist Strap into the open edge of Clutch at a slight angle and sew through all four layers across the top of Clutch to secure Wrist Strap. Sew back and forth a few times for security. Tie off and weave in both ends. (Photo 3)



2. Cut letters out of felt to fit your Label. I drew my letters freehand with a disappearing ink fabric marker, but you can also print out letters on regular paper and cut them out to use as stencils for your felt.
3. Glue your letters to your Label with Fabri-Tac. Optionally, for security and neatness, you can stitch around each letter with needle and thread.
4. Pin Label to center of Clutch and sew Label down with long yarn tail. (Photo 4)



5. Pin your zipper to Clutch opening and sew it in.



Children's Pumpkin Hat



Make a Children's Pumpkin Hat for the fall season. This fabulous burnt orange hat can be worn through the entire season and it's perfect for Halloween, too. The spiral vine part makes it a unique and fun crochet pumpkin hat for the kids. This hat is worked in both rounds and rows allowing you to practice your crochet skills. Get in the spirit this Halloween and have your kids sport their new hat.

Materials:

- Worsted Weight Yarn
 - Model is stitched with Yarn in Burnt Orange and Green
- Crochet Hook: 6.0 mm
Scissors
Yarn Needle

Skill Level: Intermediate

Size: Toddler/Young child. You can adjust the pattern to fit any **size** by simply adding some Ch's to your foundation and some extra rows.

Note: Ch 2 does not count as a st. After row 1 you will be working **in** the BLO

Instructions:

Using Orange, Ch 30

Row 1: Hdc in 3rd ch from hk and every ch across. Turn your work. (28) (RS of Work)

Row2-32: Ch 2, turn, Hdc in each st across. **(28)**

DO NOT FASTEN OFF

You should have the WS facing you after you have finished row 32. If not, simply add one more row.

With WS facing out, fold the hat in half and Sl St the last row and foundation row together.

Fasten off.

For the top of the hat:

Turn the hat RS out.

Using GREEN, attach to the top side of your hat (Use the side with the tail)

Round 1: Ch 1, evenly Sc around the top of the hat. Join with first Sc.

Round 2: Ch 1, Sc Dec all the way around. Join with first Sc.

Continue round 2 until you have about 6 sc left.

Once you have about 6 sc left, sc in each st around until you have the stem your desired length. (Stem pictured is between 2 and 3 inches long)

Fasten off

For vine (optional):

Using green, Ch 30

Starting in 3rd ch from hk, 3 hdc in each ch across.

Fasten off leaving a long tail

Using tail attach vine next to the stem.

Weave in all ends.

Halloween Doily



Decorate your home for Halloween with this black and orange Halloween Doily. It's an intermediate crochet pattern that measures 10 inches in diameter when completed. It's perfect for Halloween because it resembles a spooky spiderweb.

Skill level: Intermediate

Crochet Hook: 6.0 mm

Yarn Weight(4) Medium Weight/Worsted Weight and Aran (16-20 stitches to 4 inches)

MATERIALS:

Black - Less than 1 ounce)

Orange - Less than 1 ounce)

Stitches: ch, sc, sl st, hdc, dc, tr.

Entire pattern is worked with Right Side facing.

R1: With Black, ch4. Dc in 4th ch from hook.

(Ch1, 2dc in same ch) 5 times.

Ch1. Join with sl st in top of beg ch4.

Fasten off. (Right Side)

R2: Join Orange with a sc in any ch-sp.

(Ch4, sc in next ch-sp) 5 times.

Ch4. Join with sl st in first sc made.

R3: Continue with Orange. Do not turn.

Sl st in next ch4 sp.

Ch3, (dc, ch2, 2dc) in same ch-sp.
[Ch2 (2dc, ch2, 2dc) in next ch-sp] 5 times.
Ch2. Join with sl st in top of beg ch3.
Fasten off.

R4: Join Black with a sc in the ch2 sp of any 4dc group.
8tr in next ch-sp.
(Sc in next ch-sp; 8tr in next ch-sp) 5 times.
Join with sl st in first sc made.
Fasten off.

R5: Join Orange with a sc in the sp bet the posts of
the 2 center stitches of any 8tr group.
(Ch5, dc in next sc. Ch5, sc in center of next 8tr group) 5 times.
Ch5, dc in next sc. Ch5, join with sl st in first sc made.

R6: Continue with Orange. Sl st in next ch-sp.
Ch3. 5dc in same sp.
Ch1. (6dc in next ch-sp, Ch1) around.
Join with sl st in top of beg ch3.

R7: Continue with Orange. Ch3. Dc in next 5dc.
(Dc, ch2, dc) in next ch-sp.
*Dc in next 6dc. (Dc, ch2, dc) in next ch-sp.
Rep from * around.
Join with sl st in top of beg ch3.
Fasten off.

R8: Join Black with sc in any ch-2 sp.
(Hdc, dc, hdc, sc) in same sp.
Sc in 8sts.
*(Sc, hdc, dc, hdc, sc) in ch-2 sp.
Sc in 8sts.
Rep from * around.
Join with sl st in first sc made.

Fasten off.

Free Crochet Bag Patterns for Candy

Crochet Hungry Monster Candy Bag



"How much fun would your little one have while walking around trick-or-treating, feeding their own little Hungry Monster Candy Bag? I know Claire sure can't wait to use this little guy. She and her older brother have been trying to figure out just how much candy this little guy can eat. I used 5 different colors yarn to make this cute bag, but acrylic and other fibers will work well, too. You can easily use yarn you have in your stash."

Skill level: Easy

Crochet Hook: 6.0 mm

Yarn Weight(4) Medium Weight/Worsted Weight and Aran (16-20 stitches to 4 inches)

Measuring Tape

Scissors

Tapestry Needle

Stitch Abbreviations

ch(s): chain

st(s): stitch(es)

sl st(s): slip stitch(es)

sc: single crochet

hdc: half double crochet

- yo: yarn over
- SM: stitch marker
- FLO: front loop only
- BLO: back loop only

RS: right side
WS: wrong side
Rep: repeat
Join w/ a sc
Invisible Join Technique
Surface Crochet

Gauge

- In sc: 7.25 sts x 7.75 rows = 2"

Finished Size

- Top to Bottom (*without handle*): 7.5" to 11" W x 13.5" H

Notes

- Beginning chains are not counted as a stitch or included in stitch count.
- The first stitch of each row is worked into the same stitch as the turning chain, unless stated otherwise.
- I tend to crochet on the tighter side. You may find yourself needing to go down a hook size (or two) to properly meet gauge, but gauge isn't critical for this project. Use the invisible join technique ([Click HERE for tutorial](#)) when fastening off all round pieces.

Hungry Monster Candy Bag Instructions

Top of Monster' s Head

Note: The Top of Monster's Head is worked in continuous rounds. I highly suggest the use of a stitch marker to mark the beginning/end of each round. As you complete a round, move the stitch marker up.

Rnd 1 (MC): Using a 5.00mm crochet hook, ch 21, 3 sc in 2nd ch **from** your hook, sc in each of the next 18 chs, 3 sc in last ch, rotate to work along the bottom of the foundation ch, sc in each of the next 18 chs. (42 sts)

Rnd 2: [2 sc in each of the next 3 sts, sc in each of the next 18 sts] **work** from [to] twice. (48 sts)

Rnd 3: [(2 sc in the next st, sc in the next st) 3 times, sc in each of the next 18 sts] work from [to] twice. (54 sts)

Rnd 4: sc in each of the next 4sts, 2 sc in **the** next st, sc in each of the next 26 sts, 2 sc in the next st, sc in the next 22 sts. (56 sts)

Rnds 5 – 9: Sc in each st around. (56 sts) **Do** not fasten off. Continue on to Creating **the** Mouth Opening.

Creating the Mouth Opening

Row 1 (RS): **This is a partial row.* Sc in each of the next 13 sts. Turn. (13 sts)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each of the next 40 sts. Turn. (40 sts)

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in each of the next 5 sts, 2 sc in each of the next 2 sts, sc in each of the next 26 sts, 2 sc in each of the next 2 sts, sc in each of the next 5 sts. Turn. (44 sts)

Rows 4 – 5: Ch 1, 2 sc in the same st as ch 1, sc in each st across to the last st, 2 sc in the last st. Turn. (48 sts) at the end of Row 5.

Rows 6 – 7: Ch 1, sc in each st across. Turn (48 sts)

Row 8: Ch 1, 2 sc in the same st as ch 1, sc in each st across to the last st, 2 sc in the last st. Turn. (50 sts)

Row 9: Ch 1, 2 sc in the same st as ch 1, sc in each st across to the **last** st, 2 sc in the next st, loosely ch 8, skip over the gap created by the mouth and join yarn w/ a sc in the next st (first st of this rnd). (52 sts + 8 chs + sc join)

Do not fasten off. Do not Turn. Continue on to Body of Monster.



Body of Monster

Go back to working in continuous rounds. Make sure to move your stitch marker up as you complete each round.

Rnd 1 (RS): Sc in each st and ch around. **(60 sts)** *See photo above.*

Rnd 2: Sc in each of the next 9 sts, 2 sc in **the** next st, sc in each of the next 30 sts, **2** sc in the next st, sc in each of the next 19 sts. (62 sts)

Rnd 3: Sc in each st around. (62 sts)

Rnd 4: Sc in each of the next 10 sts, 2 sc in the next st, sc in each of the next 31 **sts**, 2 sc in the next st, sc in each of the next 19 sts. (64 sts)

Rnd 5: Sc in each st around. (64 sts)

Rnd 6: Sc in each of the next 11 sts, 2 sc in the next st, sc in each of the next 32 sts, 2 sc in the next st, sc in each of the next 19 sts. (66 sts)

Rnd 7: Sc in each st around. (66 sts)

Rnd 8: Sc in each of the next 12 sts, 2 sc in the next st, sc in each of the next 33 sts, 2 sc in the next st, sc in each of the next 19 sts. (68 sts)

Rnd 9: Sc in each st around. (68 sts)

Rnd 10: Sc in each of the next 13 sts, 2 sc in the next st, sc in each **of** the next 34 sts, 2 sc in the next st, sc in each of the next 19 sts. (70 sts)

Rnd 11: Sc in each st around. (70 sts)

Rnd 12: Sc in each of the next 14 sts, 2 sc in the next st, sc in each **of** the next 35 sts, 2 sc in the next st, sc in each of the next 19 sts. (72 sts)

Rnd 13: Sc in each st around. (72 sts)

Rnd 14: Sc in each of the next 15 sts, 2 sc in the next st, sc in each **of** the next 36 sts, 2 sc in the next st, sc in each of the next 19 sts. (74 sts)

Rnd 15: Sc in each st around. (74 sts)

Rnd 16: Sc in each of the next 16 sts, 2 sc **in** the next st, sc in each of the next 37 **sts**, 2 sc in the next st, sc in each of the next 19 sts. (76 sts)

Rnd 17: Sc in each st around. (76 sts)

Rnd 18: Sc in each of the next 17 sts, 2 sc **in** the next st, sc in each of the next 38 **sts**, 2 sc in the next st, sc in each of the next 19 sts. (78 sts)

Rnd 19: Sc in each st around. (78 sts)

Rnd 20: Sc in each of the next 18 sts, 2 sc in the next st, sc in each of the next 39 **sts**, 2 sc in the next st, sc in each of the next 19 sts. (80 sts)

Rnd 21: Sc in each st around. (80 sts)

Rnd 22: Sc in each of the next 19 sts, 2 sc in the next st, sc in each of the next 40 sts, 2 sc in the next st, sc in each of the next 19 sts. (82 sts)

Rnd 23: Sc in each st around. (82 sts)

Rnd 24: Sc in each of the next 20 sts, 2 sc in the next st, sc in each of the next 41 sts, 2 sc in the next st, sc in each of the next 19 sts. (84 sts)

Rnd 25: Sc in each st around. (84 sts)

Rnd 26: Sc in each of the next 21 sts, 2 sc in the next st, sc in each **of** the next 42 sts, 2 sc in the next st, sc in each of the next 19 sts. (86 sts)

Rnd 27: Sc in each st around. (86 sts)

Do not fasten off. Continue on to Wavy Edges.

Wavy Edges

Set-up: BLO sl st in each of the next 6 sts. Does not count in stitch **count** and is only done to move the beginning of the rows over without having to fasten off and weave in more ends. Make sure to move your SM over.

First Wave

Row 1: Sc in each of the next 32 sts. Turn. (32 sts)

Rows 2 – 9: Ch 1, skip the first st, sc in each **st** across to the last st, (skip the last **st**). Turn. (16 sts at the end of Row 9)

Fasten off. Continue on to Second Wave.

Second Wave

Row 1: Join yarn w/ a sc into the next st **on** Row 27 of the Body of Monster, sc in **each** of the next 10 sts. Turn. (11 sts)

Rows 2 – 5: Ch 1, skip the first st, sc in each st across to the last st, (skip the last **st**). Turn. (3 sts at the end of Row 5)

Fasten off. Continue on to Third Wave.

Third Wave

Row 1: Join yarn w/a sc into the next st of Row 27 of the Body of Monster, sc in each of the next 31 sts. Turn. (32 sts)

Rows 2 – 9: Ch 1, skip the first st, sc in each st across to the last st, (skip the last st). Turn. (16 sts at the end of Row 9)

Fasten off. Continue on to Fourth Wave.

Fourth Wave

Row 1: Join yarn w/ a sc into the next st of Row 27 of the Body of **Monster**, sc in each of the next 10 sts. Turn. (11 sts)

Rows 2 – 5: Ch 1, skip the first st, sc in each st across to the last st, (**skip** the last st). Turn. (3 sts at the end of Row 5)

Fasten off. Weave in all ends. Continue on to Seam to Join the Waves.

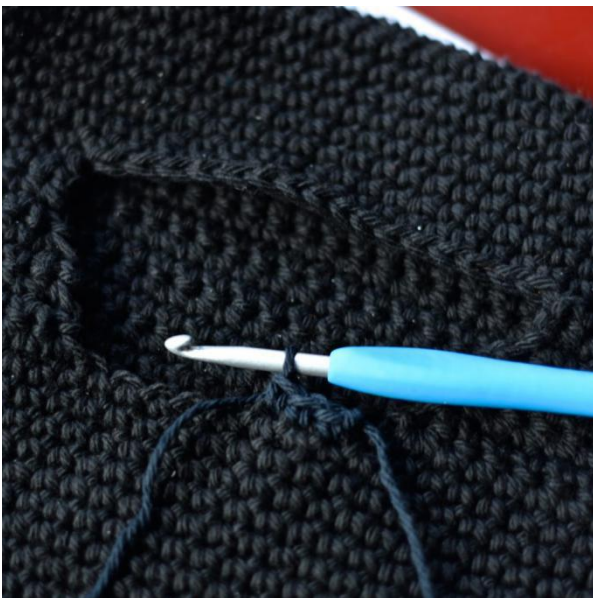
Seam to Join the Waves

Lay the bag flat with the front facing you. Join yarn w/ a sc through both layers, in the st furthest to the right, sc in each st across the bottom of the bag working down and up the waves. Stitch count isn't crucial. *See photos below.* Fasten off. Weave in ends. Continue on to Edging the Mouth Opening.



Edging the Mouth Opening

Join yarn w/ a sc in any st around the mouth opening, sc in each st and side of each row around the opening. Join w/ a sl st to the 1st st. Stitch count isn't crucial. Fasten off. Weave in ends. Continue on to Inside Mouth Panel.



Inside Mouth Panel

Row 1 (orange): Ch 21, sc in the 2nd ch **from** your hook and in each ch across. **Turn.** (20 sts)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each st across. Turn. (20 **sts**) Rep Row 2 until panel measures a **minimum** of 3".

Fasten off. Weave in ends. Continue on to Teeth.

Teeth ~ Make 3

Row 1 (white): Ch 5, sc in the 2nd ch from your hook and in each ch across. Turn. (4 sts)

Rows 2 – 4: Ch 1, skip the 1st st, sc in each remaining st across. Turn. (1 st) at the end of Row 4.

Fasten off. Weave in ends. Make as many teeth as you'd like. Continue on to Whites of the Eyes.

Whites of the Eyes ~ Make 2

Eyes are worked in continuous rounds.

Rnd 1 (white): Ch 4, sl st into 4th ch to form a ring, ch 1, work 8 sc **into** ring. (8 sts)

Rnd 2: [2 sc into each of the next 2 sts, 2 hdc into each of the next 2 sts] work from [to] twice. Join w/ a sl st to the 1st st. (16 sts)

Fasten off leaving a 10" tail of yarn for sewing. Continue on to Pupils.

Pupils ~ Make 2

Rnd 1 (black): Ch 2, work 6 sc into the 2nd ch from your hook. Join **w/** a sl st to the 1st st. (6 sts)

Fasten off leaving an 8" tail of yarn for sewing. Continue on to Arms.

Arms (handle)

Arms are worked in continuous rounds.

Color scheme: 2 rounds orange, 2 rounds **purple**, 2 round green. I started with and **ended** with 2 rounds of orange.

Rnd 1 (orange): Ch 17, sc in the 2nd ch **from** your hook and in each ch across. (16 sts)

Rnd 2 (orange): Bring the last st from Rnd 1 to meet the 1st st from Rnd 1, begin **Rnd 2** by working the 1st st from Rnd 2 into the 1st st from Rnd 1, sc in each st around.

Rnds 3 – 80 (or until length reaches 21"): Sc in each st around. Switch colors every **other** round.

Fasten off. Stitch gap closed between the first and last stitches of Rnd 1. Weave in ends. Continue on to Spider's Body.

Spider' s Body ~ Make as many as you wish!

Rnd 1 (green, orange, or purple): Ch 2, work 6 sc into the 2nd ch from your hook. Join w/ a sl st to the 1st st. (6 sts)

Fasten off leaving an 12" tail of yarn for sewing & making legs. Continue on to Finishing.

Finishing ~ See Photos Below

Eyes: Using a yarn needle and black yarn tail, sew 1 pupil to **each** white eye. Using a yarn needle and white yarn, sew the eyes onto the bag above the mouth opening. See photos.

Teeth: Using a yarn needle and black yarn, sew teeth onto **the** inside edge of the mouth opening in any position you'd like. See photo for ideas.

Inside Mouth Panel: Position the panel inside the monster's **mouth**, long edge of the panel in a horizontal position, just above the top edge of the mouth opening (and above where you sewed the teeth on). Using a yarn needle and black yarn, sew the panel to the inside of the bag. Sew the top edge of the panel only.

- **Arms:** Position one short end of the arm on the side of the head with top edge of the arm lined up with the top edge of the mouth. Using a yarn needle and 14-18" piece of orange yarn, sew that end onto the head. Before sewing the opposite side on, twist the

arm halfway around (this will help it lay more nicely) and then sew it onto the other side of the head. See photos.

Spider Web Strings: Add strings of **spider** webbing using white yarn and a **surface** crochet coming from the monster's mouth. Make them each different lengths. Weave in ends. The ends nearest his mouth I wrapped around the edge of the mouth opening to make them appear as if coming out of his mouth. See pics.

Spiders: Using a yarn needle and tail of yarn, sew 1 spider on the bag at the **end** of each spider web string. After attaching the spider's body, use the extra yarn to make little legs (*the legs on mine are approximately 1/2" long*). If you choose to make more than a couple spiders, sew them on wherever you'd like. See pics.

Optional: If the top of his head leans forward or backwards, simply tack **stitch** his arms to the side of his head about 1.5" up from where you attached them. Weave in any ends that are left.





Pumpkin Candy Bag



Kids will love keeping their candy in this Crocheted Pumpkin Candy Bag. This free Halloween crochet pattern begins by making a magic circle and is worked in rounds. The handle is crocheted separately and sewn on at the end. This crocheted bag measures approximately 7 inches high and 11 inches wide when complete. If you have more than one child, add a crocheted appliqué to each one for a bit of personalization, or use different shades of orange yarn to differentiate between the bags.

Skill Level: Intermediate

Materials:

Worsted Weight Acrylic Yarn
Crochet Hook: 6.0 mm
Tapestry Needle

Size: Approx. 7 in. high and 11 in. wide.

Special Stitches:

hdc2tog: Yarn over, insert hook into designated st and pull up a loop, **yarn** over again and insert hook into next stitch and pull up a loop, yarn over and pull through all 5 loops on hook.

FPdc: Yarn over, insert hook from front to back to front round post of specified st and pull up a loop, yarn over and pull through 2 loops, yarn over again and pull through remaining 2 loops.

Instructions:

Make a magic ring.

Foundation Round: Ch 2 (counts as st here and throughout), work 5 hdc in ring, join — 6 sts.

Round 1: Ch 2, work 1 hdc in same stitch **as** join, 2 hdc in each st around, join — **12** sts.

Round 2: Ch 2, work 1 hdc in same stitch **as** join, 1 hdc in next st, *2 hdc in next st, **1** hdc in next, rep from * around, join — 18 sts.

Round 3: Ch 2, work 1 hdc in same stitch **as** join, 1 hdc in each of the next 2 sts, *2 **hdc** in next st, 1 hdc in each of the next 2 sts, rep from * around, join — 24 sts.

Round 4: Ch 2, work 1 hdc in same stitch **as** join, 1 hdc in each of the next 3 sts, *2 **hdc** in next st, 1 hdc in each of the next 3 sts, rep from * around, join — 30 sts.

Round 5: Ch 2, work 1 hdc in same stitch **as** join, 1 hdc in each of the next 4 sts, *2 **hdc** in next st, 1 hdc in each of the next 4 sts, rep from * around, join — 36 sts.

Round 6: Ch 2, working in back loops only, 1 hdc in each st around, join — 36 sts.

Round 7: Ch 2, *work 1 FPdc in hdc directly below, 1 hdc in each of the next 2 sts, **2** hdc in next, 1 hdc in each of the next 3 sts, rep from * around, join — 42 sts.

Round 8: Ch 2, *work 1 FPdc in hdc directly below, 1 hdc in each of the next 7 sts, rep from * around, join — 42 sts.

Round 9: Ch 2, *work 1 FPdc in hdc directly below, 1 hdc in each of the next 3 sts, 2 hdc in next, 1 hdc in each of the next 3 sts, rep from * around, join — 48 sts.

Round 10: Ch 2, *work 1 FPdc in hdc directly below, 1 hdc in each of the next 8 sts, rep from * around, join — 48 sts.

Round 11: Ch 2, *work 1 FPdc in hdc directly below, 1 hdc in each of the next 3 sts, 2 hdc in next, 1 hdc in each of the next 4 sts, rep from * around, join — 54 sts.

Rounds 12 through 14: Ch 2, *work 1 FPdc in hdc directly below, **1** hdc in each of the next 9 sts, rep from * around, join — 54 sts.

Round 15: Ch 2, *work 1 FPdc in hdc directly below, 1 hdc in each **of** the next 4 sts, hdc2tog, 1 hdc in each of the next 3 sts, rep from * around, join — 48 sts.

Round 16: Ch 2, *work 1 FPdc in hdc directly below, 1 hdc in each **of** the next 8 sts, rep from * around, join — 48 sts.

Round 17: Ch 2, *work 1 FPdc in hdc directly below, 1 hdc in each **of** the next 3 sts, hdc2tog, 1 hdc in each of the next 3 sts, rep from * around, join — 42 sts.

Round 18: Ch 2, *work 1 FPdc in hdc directly below, 1 hdc in each **of** the next 7 sts, rep from * around, join — 42 sts.

Round 19: Ch 2, *work 1 FPdc in hdc directly below, 1 hdc in each **of** the next 3 sts, hdc2tog, 1 hdc in each of the next 2 sts, rep from * around, join — 36 sts.

Round 20: Ch 2, *work 1 FPdc in hdc directly below, 1 hdc in each of the next 6 sts, rep from * around, join — 36 sts.

Round 21: Ch 2, *work 1 FPdc in hdc **directly** below, 1 hdc in each of the next 2 **sts**, hdc2tog, 1 hdc in each of the next 2 sts, rep from * around, join — 30 sts.

Round 22: Ch 1 (does not count as st), **working** back across stitches just made, **work** 1 rev sc in each st around, join — 30 sts.

Fasten off and weave in ends.

Handle:

Ch 45.

Row 1: Work 1 sc in 2nd ch from hook and each ch across, turn — 44 sts.

Rows 2 through 4: Ch 1 (does not count as st), work 1 sc in each st across, turn — **44** sts.

Fasten off.

Using the same color yarn and a tapestry needle, sew the handle to pumpkin bag.

Weave in ends.



Homemade Halloween Treat Bag



Add a homemade touch to your trick-or-treating adventures this year with this Homemade Halloween Treat Bag. Your little ghosts and goblins will love toting this crocheted bag around with them as they collect their candy. The candy corn design is the perfect color combination for this festive treat bag, but feel free to use any 3 colors of worsted weight yarn you prefer. Add a decorative ribbon for a nice finishing touch. This free crochet pattern is quick and easy to work up.

Materials:

- white, orange, and yellow worsted weight yarn
- Tapestry needle
- Ribbon
- Yummy Halloween treats!

Size: Approx. 6 in. high and 6 in. wide.

Instructions:

With white, make a magic ring.

Round 1: Ch 1 (does not count as st here and throughout), work 6 **sc** in ring, join — 6 sts. Pull tail to close up ring and weave in to secure.

Round 2: Ch 1, work 1 sc in same stitch as join and in next st, 2 sc **in** next, 1 sc in each of the next 2 sts, 2 sc in next, join — 8 sts.

Round 3: Ch 1, work 1 sc in same stitch as join and in each of the **next** 2 sts, 2 sc in next, 1 sc in each of the next 3 sts, 2 sc in next, join — 10 sts.

Round 4: Ch 1, work 1 sc in same stitch as join and in each of the next 3 sts, 2 sc in next, 1 sc in each of the next 4 sts, 2 sc in next, join — 12 sts.

Round 5: Ch 1, work 1 sc in same stitch as **join** and in each of the next 4 sts, 2 sc **in** next, 1 sc in each of the next 5 sts, 2 sc in next, join — 14 sts.

Round 6: Ch 1, work 1 sc in same stitch as **join** and in each of the next 5 sts, 2 sc **in** next, 1 sc in each of the next 6 sts, 2 sc in next, join — 16 sts.

Round 7: Ch 1, work 1 sc in same stitch as **join** and in each of the next 6 sts, 2 sc **in** next, 1 sc in each of the next 7 sts, 2 sc in next, join — 18 sts.



Round 8: Join orange, ch 1, work 1 sc in same stitch as join and in **each** of the next 7 sts, 2 sc in next, 1 sc in each of the next 8 sts, 2 sc in next, join — 20 sts.

Round 9: Ch 1, work 1 sc in same stitch as join and in each of the **next** 8 sts, 2 sc in next, 1 sc in each of the next 9 sts, 2 sc in next, join — 22 sts.

Round 10: Ch 1, work 1 sc in same stitch as join and in each of the **next** 9 sts, 2 sc in next, 1 sc in each of the next 10 sts, 2 sc in next, join — 24 sts.

Round 11: Ch 1, work 1 sc in same stitch as join and in each of the next 10 sts, 2 sc in next, 1 sc in each of the next 11 sts, 2 sc in next, join — 26 sts.

Round 12: Ch 1, work 1 sc in same stitch as join and in each of the next 11 sts, 2 sc in next, 1 sc in each of the next 12 sts, 2 sc in next, join — 28 sts.

Round 13: Ch 1, work 1 sc in same stitch **as** join and in each of the next 12 sts, 2 **sc** in next, 1 sc in each of the next 13 sts, 2 sc in next, join — 30 sts.

Round 14: Ch 1, work 1 sc in same stitch **as** join and in each of the next 13 sts, 2 **sc** in next, 1 sc in each of the next 14 sts, 2 sc in next, join — 32 sts.

Round 15: Ch 1, work 1 sc in same stitch **as** join and in each of the next 14 sts, 2 **sc** in next, 1 sc in each of the next 15 sts, 2 sc in next, join — 34 sts.

Round 16: Join yellow, ch 1, work 1 sc in **same** stitch as join and in each of the next **15** sts, 2 sc in next, 1 sc in each of the next 16 sts, 2 sc in next, join — 36 sts.

Round 17: Ch 1, work 1 sc in same stitch as join and in each of the next 16 sts, 2 **sc** in next, 1 sc in each of the next 17 sts, 2 sc in next, join — 38 sts.

Round 18: Ch 1, work 1 sc in same stitch as join and in each of the next 17 sts, 2 **sc** in next, 1 sc in each of the next 18 sts, 2 sc in next, join — 40 sts.

Round 19: Ch 1, work 1 sc in same stitch as join and in each of the next 18 sts, 2 sc in next, 1 sc in each of the next 19 sts, 2 sc in next, join — 42 sts.

Round 20: Ch 1, work 1 sc in same stitch as join and in each of the next 19 sts, 2 sc in next, 1 sc in each of the next 20 sts, 2 sc in next, join — 44 sts.

Round 21: Ch 3 (counts as dc), work 1 dc in each st around, join — 44 sts.

Round 22: Ch 1 (does not count as st), work 1 rev sc in each st around, join — 44 sts.
Fasten off and weave in ends.

Fill with Halloween treats and weave a ribbon through the dc stitches to close bag.
