Spiral Crochet Ornament



Add whimsy to your Christmas tree with this adorable Spiral Crochet Ornament. Quick to work up and easy to love, this crochet Christmas ornament is original and modern. We love the playful look, which would go perfect with any Christmas theme. Make this crochet ornament as a gift for family and friends, or make yourself a cute set! Not only will you love this pattern, but you'll learn a new crochet skill, too

Skill level: Easy

Materials:

- Approximately 15 yards each color
- Size 6.0 mm crochet hook
- Darning needle
- Scissors

Abbreviations

- slst – slip stitch
- sc – single crochet
- hdc – half double crochet
- dc – double crochet

Written Instructions

Christmas Crochet

With color A: create a magic ring with a sc, hdc and 2 dc. Pull up the working loop and remove your hook.

With color B: join at center of magic ring in front of the last double crochet created with color A. Make a sc, hdc and 2 dc. Pull up the working loop and remove your hook.

Draw up the magic ring. Pick up the working loop of color B and make 2 dc into the sc, the hdc and the 2 dc of color A. Pull up the working loop and remove your hook. Repeat for color A, making 2 dc in every stitch of color B. Repeat this spiral fashion until you have a total of 40 stitches of each color.

Bind off Color A. Pick up working loop of color B and make 24 chains (may make more or less to change the size of the loop). Join the chain with a slst to the last dc made with color B. Bind off and weave in ends.

Christmas Jingle Ball Ornaments



If you love the look of ball ornaments on your tree, but hate using glass ornaments because they break, then these yarn ball ornaments are the perfect crochet pattern to make this year. Red, white, and green yarn is used to work up these Christmas Jingle Ball Ornaments. Each festive crocheted ornament measures about 3 inches by 3 inches. Once you've completed the crochet portion of this free crochet ornament pattern, simply attach a piece of twine so you can hang it on your tree.

Skill level: Easy

Crochet Hook: 6.0 mm

Yarn Weight(3) Light/DK (21-24 stitches to 4 inches)

Scissors

Tapestry/Wool Needle

Toy Stuffing

Twine

Finished Size

Approximately 3 inches x 3 inches

Colours

Christmas Red

Forest Green

Snow White

Star Bauble

Round 1~ Taking your 6.0mm crochet hook and christmas red DK yarn, start of by making a Slip Knot, then crochet 2 Chains. Crochet 5 Single Crochets into the first chain you made. Slip Stitch into the top of chain 2. You should have 6 single crochets now.

Round 2~ Chain 1, then crochet a Single Crochet into the same stitch. Crochet 2 Single Crochets into every stitch all around. Slip Stitch into chain 1. You should have 12 single crochets now.

Round 3~ Chain 1, then crochet a Single Crochet into the same stitch. *Crochet 1 Single Crochet into the next stitch. Then crochet 2 Single Crochets in the next stitch. Repeat from the * all around. Slip Stitch into chain 1. You should have 18 single crochets now.

Round 4~ Chain 1, then crochet a Single Crochet into the same stitch. *Crochet 1 Single Crochet into the next 2 stitches. Then crochet 2 Single Crochets in the next stitch. Repeat from the * all around. Slip Stitch into chain 1. You should have 24 single crochets now.

Round 5~ Chain 1, then crochet a Single Crochet into the same stitch. *Crochet 1 Single Crochet into the next 3 stitches. Then crochet 2 Single Crochets in the next stitch. Repeat from the * all around. Slip Stitch into chain 1. You should have 30 single crochets now.

Round 6~ Chain 1. Crochet 1 Single Crochet into every stitch all around. Slip Stitch into chain 1.

Round 7~ Change yarn colour to forest green. Chain 1. Crochet 1 Single Crochet into every stitch all around. Slip Stitch into chain 1.

Round 8 – 12~ Change yarn colour to snow white. Chain 1. Crochet 1 Single Crochet into every stitch all around. Slip Stitch into chain 1.

Round 13~ Change yarn colour to forest green. Chain 1. Crochet 1 Single Crochet into every stitch all around. Slip Stitch into chain 1.

Round 14~ Change yarn colour to christmas red. Chain 1. Crochet 1 Single Crochet into every stitch all around. Slip Stitch into chain 1.

Round 15~ Chain 1. Crochet 1 Single Crochet into the next 2 stitches. *Crochet 1 Single Crochet Decrease. Crochet 1 Single Crochet into the next 3 stitches. Repeat from the * all around. Slip Stitch into chain 1. You should have 24 single crochets now.

Round 16~ Chain 1. Crochet 1 Single Crochet into the next stitch. *Crochet 1 Single Crochet Decrease. Crochet 1 Single Crochet into the next 2 stitches. Repeat from the * all around. Slip Stitch into chain 1. You should have 18 single crochets now.

Round 17~ Chain 1. *Crochet 1 Single Crochet Decrease. Crochet 1 Single Crochet into the next stitch. Repeat from the * all around. Slip Stitch into chain 1. You should have 12 single crochets now. *{Note: You' ll want to stuff the bauble with toy stuffing now, otherwise you won' t be able to full it later.}*

Round 18~ Chain 1. Crochet 6 Single Crochet Decreases. Slip Stitch into chain 1. You should have 6 single crochets now.

Fasten off, then sew the top of the bauble closed before weaving in any loose ends. Now attach a piece of twine to the top of the bauble so that you can hang it on your Christmas tree.

Candy Cane Bauble

Repeat pattern above, but this time alternate between crocheting 3 rounds using white yarn, and 1 round using red yarn.

Striped Bauble

Repeat pattern above, but this time alternate between crocheting 1 round of every colour (*red, green, white.*).

Holly Jolly Holiday Crochet Stocking



Using regular worsted weight yarn, a handful of colors and the puff stitch, you too can make your own Holly Jolly Holiday Crochet Stocking. This easy crochet Christmas pattern is available in two sizes, regular and large, so it's perfect for any member of the family. The colors are customizable too, so stick with a traditional holiday theme or go with the recipient's favorite hues - this holiday crochet stocking pattern will look so cute either way! This Christmas crochet pattern is also a good way to practice color changes and carrying

your yarn on the inside.

Skill level: Easy

Crochet Hook: 6.0 mm

Yarn Weight(4)Weight/Worsted Weight and Aran (16-20 stitches to 4 inches)

Crochet Gauge Gauge in DC: 14 stitches and 8 rows = 4" (10 cm)

Finished Size Regular and large

Special Instructions:

- The beginning chain does not count as a stitch.
- Start each round in the same stitch as the beginning chain until you get to the cuff.
- Join each round by slip stitching in the first stitch, not the beginning chain.
- Carry the yarn on the inside of the work between rounds.

Materials List

- Worsted weight yarn - For size regular, yarn in White/Silver (A) - 113 yards (47 gm); in True Blue (B) - 34 yards (18 gm); in Bluebell (C) - 34 yards (18 gm)) -- for size large, in White/Silver (A) - 139 yards (59 gm); in Red/Silver (B) - 60 yards (25 gm); in Green/Silver (C) - 60 yards (25 gm)
- 6.0 mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain the gauge
- Yarn needle for weaving in ends
- Stitch markers

Stocking Pattern

Christmas Crochet

Size Regular

Width = 5.75" • Height = 18"

1.

Round 1: With A - Ch 2, make 8 hdc in the 2nd chain from hook, sl st to join in first hdc (8)

Round 2: Ch 1, make 2 hdc in each st around, join (16)

Round 3: Ch 1, *hdc in first st, make 2 hdc in next st* repeat around, join (24)

Round 4: Ch 1, *hdc in first 2 sts, make 2 hdc in next st* repeat around, join (32)

Round 5: Ch 1, *hdc in first 3 sts, make 2 hdc in next st* repeat around, join (40)

Round 6: Ch 1, sc in each stitch around, join (40) - change to Color B in join.

Round 7: With B - Ch 1, *sc in first 3 sts, hdc in next st, dc in next 3 sts, hdc in next st*, repeat between * around, join in first sc (40) - change to Color A in join.

Round 8: With A - Ch 1, sc in each st around, join in first sc (40) - change to Color C in join.

Round 9: With C - Ch 2, *dc in first 3 sts, hdc in next st, sc in next 3 sts, hdc in next st*, repeat between * around, join in first dc (40) - change to Color A in join.

Round 10: With A - Ch 1, sc in each st around, join in first sc (40) - change to Color B in join.

Round 11 through Round 18: Repeat Rounds 7 through 10

Round 19: Repeat Round 7

Round 20: Repeat Round 8

Round 21: Repeat Round 9 - change to Color A in join. Fasten off Colors B and C.

Heel

Row 1: Ch 1, sc in same stitch, sc in next 15 sts, turn (16)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each stitch across, turn (16)

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in first 5 sts, sc2tog, hdc in next 2 sts, sc2tog, sc in last 5 sts, turn (14)

Row 4: Ch 1, sc in first 6 sts, hdc in next 2 sts, sc in last 6 sts, turn (14)

Row 5: Ch 1, sc in first 4 sts, sc2tog, hdc in next 2 sts, sc2tog, sc in last 4 sts, turn (12)

Row 6: Ch 1, sc in first 5 sts, hdc in next 2 sts, sc in last 5 sts, turn (12)

Row 7: Ch 1, sc in first 3 sts, sc2tog, hdc in next 2 sts, sc2tog, sc in last 3 sts, turn (10)

Row 8: Ch 1, sc in first 4 sts, hdc in next 2 sts, sc in last 4 sts, turn (10)

Row 9: Ch 1, sc in first 2 sts, sc2tog, hdc in next 2 sts, sc2tog, sc in last 2 sts, turn (8)

Christmas Crochet

Row 10: Ch 1, sc in first st, sc2tog, hdc in next 2 sts, sc2tog, sc in last st, turn (6)

Next, resume working in Rounds.

Round 22: Ch 1, sc in first 6 sts, working down the ends of the rows, evenly work 5 sc (approximately one every other row), working stitches from Round 21: sc in next 24 sts (you should be at the beginning of the other side of the heel rows), work 5 sc up the ends of the rows, join in first sc, fasten off (40) - Photo visual for round 22 below.

Sl st to join Color B in the 4th stitch of the round.

Round 23: With B - Ch 1, *sc in first 3 sts, hdc in next st, dc in next 3 sts, hdc in next st*, repeat between * around, join in first sc (40) - change to Color A in join.

Round 24: With A - Ch 1, sc in each st around, join in first sc (40) - change to Color C in join.

Round 25: With C - Ch 2, *dc in first 3 sts, hdc in next st, sc in next 3 sts, hdc in next st*, repeat between * around, join in first dc (40) - change to Color A in join.

Round 26: With A - Ch 1, sc in each st around, join in first sc (40) - change to Color B in join.

Round 27 through Round 46: Repeat Rounds 23 through 26

Round 47: Repeat Round 23

Fasten off Color B and Color C. Your seam will have travelled off center from the back of the stocking. Join Color A in the center back stitch, which should be about 6 or 7 stitches into the round. This is where you will create the loop for hanging when working the final round.

Round 48: Ch 1, sc in each st around, join in first sc, TURN your work (40)

Round 49: Ch 1, *puff st in first st, sc in next st*, repeat between * around, join in first puff st, turn (40)

Round 50: Ch 1, sc in each st around, join in first sc, turn (40)


Round 51: Ch 1, *sc in first st, puff st in next st*, repeat between * around, join in first sc, turn (40)

Round 52 through Round 55: Repeat Rounds 48 through 51

Round 56: Ch 10, sl st in first st (creates loop for hanging), sc in next st and in each st back to start, sl st to join in first sc (encases the base of the ch-10 loop) (39 sc + 10 chs)

Fasten off and weave in all ends.

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Size Large

Width = 7" • Height =
22.5" 1.

Round 1: With A - Ch 2, make 8 hdc in the 2nd chain from hook, sl st to join in first hdc (8)

Round 2: Ch 1, make 2 hdc in each st around, join (16)

Round 3: Ch 1, *hdc in first st, make 2 hdc in next st* repeat around, join (24)

Round 4: Ch 1, *hdc in first 2 sts, make 2 hdc in next st* repeat around, join (32)

Round 5: Ch 1, *hdc in first 3 sts, make 2 hdc in next st* repeat around, join (40)

Round 6: Ch 1, *hdc in first 4 sts, make 2 hdc in next st* repeat around, join (48)

Round 7: Ch 1, sc in each stitch around, join (48) - change to Color B in join.

Round 8: With B - Ch 1, *sc in first 3 sts, hdc in next st, dc in next 3 sts, hdc in next st*, repeat between * around, join in first sc (48) - change to Color A in join.

Round 9: With A - Ch 1, sc in each st around, join in first sc (48) - change to Color C in join.

Round 10: With C - Ch 2, *dc in first 3 sts, hdc in next st, sc in next 3 sts, hdc in next st*, repeat between * around, join in first dc (48) - change to Color A in join.

Round 11: With A - Ch 1, sc in each st around, join in first sc (48) - change to Color B in join.

Round 12 through Round 23: Repeat Rounds 8 through 11

Round 24: Repeat Round 8

Round 25: Repeat Round 9

Round 26: Repeat Round 10 - change to Color A in join. Fasten off Colors B and C.

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Heel

Row 1: Ch 1, sc in same stitch, sc in next 19 sts, turn (20)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each stitch across, turn (20)

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in first 6 sts, sc2tog, hdc in next 4 sts, sc2tog, sc in last 6 sts, turn (18)

Row 4: Ch 1, sc in first 7 sts, hdc in next 4 sts, sc in last 7 sts, turn (18)

Row 5: Ch 1, sc in first 5 sts, sc2tog, hdc in next 4 sts, sc2tog, sc in last 5 sts, turn (16)

Row 6: Ch 1, sc in first 6 sts, hdc in next 4 sts, sc in last 6 sts, turn (16)

Row 7: Ch 1, sc in first 4 sts, sc2tog, hdc in next 4 sts, sc2tog, sc in last 4 sts, turn (14)

Row 8: Ch 1, sc in first 5 sts, hdc in next 4 sts, sc in last 5 sts, turn (14)

Row 9: Ch 1, sc in first 3 sts, sc2tog, hdc in next 4 sts, sc2tog, sc in last 3 sts, turn (12)

Row 10: Ch 1, sc in first 4 sts, hdc in next 4 sts, sc in last 4 sts, turn (12)

Row 11: Ch 1, sc in first 2 sts, sc2tog, hdc in next 4 sts, sc2tog, sc in last 2 sts, turn (10)

Row 12: Ch 1, sc in first 3 sts, hdc in next 4 sts, sc in last 3 sts, turn (10)

Resume working in rounds.

Round 27: Ch 1, sc2tog, sc next 6 sts, sc2tog, working down the ends of the rows, evenly place 6 sc (approximately one every other row), working stitches from Round 26: sc in next 28 sts (you should be at the beginning of the other side of the heel rows), work 6 sc up the ends of the rows, join in first sc, fasten off (48) - Visual representation for this round is below.

Sl st to join Color B in the 5th stitch of the round.

Round 28: With B - Ch 1, *sc in first 3 sts, hdc in next st, dc in next 3 sts, hdc in next st*, repeat between * around, join in first sc (48) - change to Color A in join.

Round 29: With A - Ch 1, sc in each st around, join in first sc (48) - change to Color C in join.

Round 30: With C - Ch 2, *dc in first 3 sts, hdc in next st, sc in next 3 sts, hdc in next st*, repeat between * around, join in first dc (48) - change to Color A in join.

Round 31: With A - Ch 1, sc in each st around, join in first sc (48) - change to Color B in join.

Round 32 through Round 59: Repeat Rounds 28 through 31

Round 60: Repeat Round 28

Fasten off Color B and Color C. Your seam will have travelled off center from the back of the stocking. Join Color A in the center back stitch, which should be about 7 or 8 stitches into the round. This is where you will create the loop for hanging when working the final round.

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Round 61: Ch 1, sc in each st around, join in first sc, TURN your work (48)

Round 62: Ch 1, *puff st in first st, sc in next st*, repeat between * around, join in first puff st, turn (48)

Round 63: Ch 1, sc in each st around, join in first sc, turn (48)

Round 64: Ch 1, *sc in first st, puff st in next st*, repeat between * around, join in first sc, turn (48)

Round 65 through Round 68: Repeat Rounds 61 through 64

Round 69: Repeat Round 61

Round 70: Repeat Round 62

Round 71: Ch 10, sl st in first st (creates loop for hanging), sc in next st and in each st back to start, sl st to join in first sc (encases the base of the ch-10 loop) (47 sc + 10 chs)

Fasten off and weave in all ends.



Abbreviations

Puff stitch (puff st)

Yarn over, insert hook in next stitch, yarn over and pull up a loop (3 loops on hook), yarn over and pull through first 2 loops on hook (2 loops left on hook), yarn over, insert hook in same stitch, yarn over and pull up a loop (4 loops on hook), yarn over and pull through all loops on hook.

Jewel Tone Crochet Snowflake



This Jewel Tone Crochet Snowflake will show you that snowflakes don't have to be white. The gorgeous colors of this crochet pattern will make you fall in love with snowflakes in a whole new way. The yarn and design of this Christmas ornament will have your tree sparkling in no time. You'll want to work up a whole bunch of these to make your tree look completely amazing. Everyone will appreciate how

colorful your tree looks and yours will be the envy of the neighborhood.

Skill level: Easy

Crochet Hook: 6.0 mm

Yarn Weight(4) Weight/Worsted Weight and Aran (16-20 stitches to 4 inches)

Crochet Gauge 16 sc and 17 rows = 4 [10 cm].

Finished Size Approx 6 1/2 inches [16.5 cm] wide.

Materials:

- Yarn (3.5 oz/100 g; 195 yds/178 m)
 - Contrast A Fuchsia Sparkle
 - Contrast B Spring Sparkle
 - Contrast C Purple Sparkle
 - Contrast D Teal Sparkle
- Size U.S.6.0 mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge.

Abbreviations:

- Approx = Approximately
- Beg = Beginning

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- Ch = Chain(s)
- Dc = Double crochet
- Hdc = Half double crochet
- Pat = Pattern
- Rep = Repeat
- RS = Right side
- Rnd(s) = Round(s)
- Sc = Single crochet
- Sl st = Slip stitch
- Sp(s) = Space(s)
- St(s) = Stitch(es)
- Tr = Treble crochet
- WS = Wrong side

INSTRUCTIONS

Note: To join colors, work to last loops on hook of first color. Draw new color through last loops and proceed. Join all rnds with sl st.

VERSION 1

CIRCLE (make 2)

(See diagram on below).

With A, ch 4. Join with sl st to first ch to form a ring.

1st rnd: Ch 3 (counts as dc). 15 dc in ring. Join B to top of ch 3. Break A. 16 dc.

2nd rnd: With B, ch 1. 2 sc in same sp as last sl st. *1 sc in next sc. 2 sc in next sc.

Rep from * to last sc. 1 sc in last sc. Join C to first sc. 24 sc.

3rd rnd: With C, ch 3 (counts as dc). 2 dc in next sc. 1 dc in next sc. 1 dc in back loop only of next sc. *1 dc in next sc. 2 dc in next sc. 1 dc in next sc. 1 dc in back loop only of next sc. Rep from * around. Join B to top of ch 3. Break C. 30 dc.

4th rnd: With C, ch 1. 1 sc in same sp as last sl st. *2 sc in next dc. 1 sc in each of next 2 dc. Working in front of rnds, 1 tr in rem front loop of sc from 2nd rnd. Skip next dc (behind tr).** 1 sc in next dc. Rep from * around, ending last rep at **. Join to first sc. Fasten off. 36 sts.

Join Circles: Place WS of Circles facing each other, matching pat (aligning tr sts).

1st rnd: Working through both thicknesses, join D with sl st through any tr of 4th rnd.

Ch 1. 1 sc in same sp. *1 sc in each of next 2 sc. 2 sc in next sc. 1 sc in each of next 2 sc.** 1 sc in next tr. Rep from * around, ending at **. Join A to first sc.

2nd rnd: With A, sl st in next sc. Ch 1. 1 sc in same sp. *1 hdc in next sc. 2 dc in next sc. (Ch 3. Sl st back into first of 3 ch) twice. Ch 3. Sl st back into last dc worked – trefoil picot worked. 2 dc in next sc. 1 hdc in next sc. 1 sc in next sc.** Ch 1. Skip next sc. 1 sc in next sc. Rep from * around, ending at **. Ch 1. Skip last sc. Join to first sc. Fasten off.


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3rd rnd: Join D with sl st in any ch-1 sp. Ch 1. 1 sc in same sp. *Ch 6. 1 sc in top point of next trefoil picot. Ch 6.** 1 sc in next ch-1 sp. Rep from * around, ending at **. Join to first sc.

4th rnd: *8 sc in next ch-6 sp. 1 sc in next sc. Ch 3. Sl st back into last sc worked - picot made. 8 sc in next ch-6 sp. Skip next sc. Rep from * 4 times more. 8 sc in next ch-6 sp. 1 sc in next sc. Ch 32 for hanging loop. Sl st back into last sc worked. 8 sc in next ch-6 sp. Skip last sc. Join to first sc. Fasten off.

VERSION 2

Work as for Version 1 substituting B for A, A for B, D for C and C for D.

Snowman Wall Hanging

This jolly fellow would be great hanging on the front door to welcome friends, or just as a decorative wall hanging in the home. The Snowman Wall Hanging is an easy crochet pattern that helps you create your own flat snowman motif. You'll be working with multiple colors, both within the same piece and for separate pieces to sew together at the end, so if you're worried about color changes, don't be - this is an easy enough pattern to practice on. Hang this friendly crochet snowman on your front door or anywhere in your home to add a little bit of extra holiday cheer to your home this season.



Skill level: Easy

Crochet Hook: 6.0 mm

Yarn Weight(4)Weight/Worsted Weight and Aran (16-20 stitches to 4 inches)

Crochet Gauge Gauge in SC: 13 sts and 14 rows = 4" (10 cm)

Finished Size 9" wide by 20" tall

Notes:

- If a round or row has a beginning chain, it does not count as a stitch.
- Unless directed otherwise, rounds are worked in a spiral; use a stitch marker to track the first stitch of each round.

Materials List

- INSCRAFT worsted weight yarn in: White, Holly, Berry, Black, Mango
- 6.5 mm (I-9) crochet hook or size needed to obtain the gauge
- 1" Black buttons (2)
- ½" Black buttons (5)
- Poly fiber fill (optional)
- Stitch markers

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- Yarn needle

Pattern

Top Hat

1. **Round 1:** With Black - Ch 15, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in next 12 chs, make 2 sc in last ch. Working the other side of the chain: sc in next 13 chs, do not join (28)
2. **Round 2:** Sc in each st around (28)
3. **Round 3:** *Sc2tog, sc in next 12 sts* 2 times (26)
4. **Round 4 - 13:** Sc in each st around (26)
5. Secure the working loop of Black. Join Red in first stitch.
Round 14: With Red - Ch 1, sc in each st around, do not join (26)
6. **Round 15:** Sc in each st around, sl st first st, fasten off (26)
Continue with Black yarn from Round 13.
7. **Round 16:** With Black - *Sc in first st, make 2 sc in next st*, repeat between * around, do not join (39)
8. **Round 17:** *Sc in first 2 sts, make 2 sc in next st*, repeat between * around, do not join (52)
9. **Round 18:** Sc in each st around, do not join (52)
10. **Round 19:** Ch 1, hdc in each stitch around, sl st to join in first hdc (52) Fasten off, leaving a lengthy tail for sewing.

Nose

1. **Row 1:** With Mango - Ch 11, sl st in 2nd ch from hook, sc in next 3 chs, hdc in next 3 chs, dc in last 3 chs, turn (10)
2. **Row 2:** Ch 2, dc in first st, dc in next 4 sts, sc in next 3 sts, sl st in last 2 sts (10)
Fasten off, leaving a lengthy tail for sewing.

Head

Make 2

1. **Round 1:** With White - Ch 2, make 6 sc in the 2nd ch from hook, do not join (6)
2. **Round 2:** Make 2 sc in each st around (12)
3. **Round 3:** *Sc in first st, make 2 sc in next st*, repeat around (18)
4. **Round 4:** *Sc in first 2 sts, make 2 sc in next st*, repeat around (24)
5. **Round 5:** *Sc in first 3 sts, make 2 sc in next st*, repeat around (30)
6. **Round 6:** *Sc in first 4 sts, make 2 sc in next st*, repeat around (36)
7. **Round 7:** *Sc in first 5 sts, make 2 sc in next st*, repeat around (42)
8. **Round 8:** *Sc in first 6 sts, make 2 sc in next st*, repeat around (48)
9. **Round 9:** *Sc in first 7 sts, make 2 sc in next st*, repeat around (54)

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10. **Round 10:** *Sc in first 8 sts, make 2 sc in next st*, repeat around (60)
11. **Round 11:** *Sc in first 9 sts, make 2 sc in next st*, repeat around (66)
12. **Round 12:** *Sc in first 10 sts, make 2 sc in next st*, repeat around (72)
13. **Round 13:** *Sc in first 11 sts, make 2 sc in next st*, repeat around (78)
14. The increases on the next two rounds are staggered to give the circle a more rounded shape.

Round 14: Sc in first 4 sts, *make 2 sc in next st, sc in next 12 sts*, repeat between * around (84) - Your last repeat section will end with 8 sts instead of 12.

15. **Round 15:** Sc in first 8 sts, *make 2 sc in next st, sc in next 13 sts*, repeat between * around (90) - Your last repeat section will end with 5 sts instead of 12.

16. **Head Piece # 1:** Sl st in next st and fasten off.

At this point, I pinned the hat in place at the top of Piece # 1 so I could configure the placement of the eyes, nose and mouth. I then sewed the face parts only in place before continuing with Head Piece # 2.

17. **Head Piece # 2:** Do not fasten off. With wrong sides facing, hold piece # 1 and piece # 2 together. Working through both layers of the outer round: Sc in each stitch back to start, join in first sc. If preferred, you can lightly stuff the head with poly fiber fill before sealing it up completely. Fasten off.

18. You can now sew the hat on top of the head. Place the seamed head pieces between the two brim layers of the hat and use the hat tail to sew through all 4 layers, going across the whole length of the brim.

Neck Scarf

1. Mark the bottom 25 stitches of the head, as shown.



2. Turn your work so the stitch markers are at the top. With the right side of the Snowman facing you, slip stitch to join Color Red in the Front Loop only of marked stitch A. The first round will be worked in the front loops only across to Marker B, then the piece is turned and you will work in the back loops only of the same stitches back to Marker A.

3. **Round 1:** Ch 1, working in Front Loops only, sc in same st, sc in next 3 sts, make 2 sc in next st, *sc in next 4 sts, make 2 sc in next st*, repeat between * to marked stitch B. Turn your work and continue working in the un-used Back Loops only: repeat the instructions between * back to start, do not join (60)

4. **Round 2:** Hdc in first 8 sts, sc in next 14 sts, hdc in next 16 sts, sc in next 14 sts, hdc in last 8 sts, do not join (60)
5. **Round 3:** Hdc in first 7 sts, sc in next 16 sts, hdc in next 14 sts, sc in next 16 sts, hdc in last 7 sts, do not join (60)
6. **Round 4:** Hdc in first 6 sts, sc in next 18 sts, hdc in next 12 sts, sc in next 18 sts, hdc in last 6 sts, do not join (60)
7. **Round 5:** Sc in each stitch around, do not join (60)
8. **Round 6 and 7:** Repeat Round 5
9. The next row of SC stitches will be worked through both layers to seam the bottom of the scarf.
10. **Row 8:** Sl st in next st to move your starting position. Ch 1, sc across, fasten off (30)

Dangling Scarf Piece

This piece is worked in a tube. Do not join the rounds. Leave a lengthy beginning tail for sewing.

1. **Round 1:** Ch 21, sc in 2nd ch from hook, and in each chain to end, bring the ends together and sl st in first sc to form a ring (20)
2. **Round 2:** Ch 1, sc in each stitch around, do not join (20)
3. Repeat Round 2 until tube measures approximately 5" in length.
4. **Final Row:** Working through both layers, sc across the bottom edge of the piece to close the end (10)
5. Fasten off. Center the un-seamed edge over the neck scarf, just below the snowman's chin and sew in place using the beginning tail.
6. **Scarf Fringe:** Cut 20 pieces of yarn that are each 5" in length. Use 2 pieces of yarn per stitch to add fringe along the bottom edge of the scarf. Trim the ends to an even length.

You'll want to work up a bunch of these for your crocheting friends: The Crocheter's Favorite Ornament. It's a little crochet basket with tiny balls of yarn in it! What could be a more perfect gift for a crocheter? You can let everyone know about your talents with this Christmas ornament. They'll probably notice it and then notice all the crochet hats and blankets you've made around the house. Your renown of crochet can be known even better now with this crochet ornament.



Skill level: Easy

Crochet Hook: 6.0mm

Yarn Weight(4) Weight/Worsted Weight and Aran (16-20 stitches to 4 inches)

Abbreviations

A, B, C = Color A, Color B, Color C, etc

ch = chain

sc = single crochet sl

st(s) = slip stitches

st(s) = stitch(es)

* = repeat whatever follows the * as indicated.

Basket

With A, ch 14, leaving a long tail.

Row 1 (right side): Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn—13 sc.

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in first sc, * skip next sc, sc in next sc, ch 1, sc in skipped st; repeat from * across, turn.

Skipping all ch-1 spaces, repeat Row 2 until piece measures 3¾" (9.5 cm) ending on a

wrong side row.

Last Row (right side): Ch 1, sc in each sc across skipping all ch-1 spaces, turn—13 sc.

Handle

Ch 25.

With right side of Row 1 facing, and taking care not to twist ch, join with sl st in first foundation ch (near yarn tail), ch 1; working in back ridge loops, sl st in each ch across. Fasten off, leaving a long tail.

Finishing

Fold piece lengthwise with right side facing inward. With long tails and yarn needle, sew side seams and reinforce ends of handle.

Turn Basket right side out, and gently push out corners for a rounded shape.

Weave in ends.

Balls of Yarn

Wind small balls of each B, C, D and D, measuring 1" (2.5 cm) in diameter. Cut yarn leaving a long tail, and weave tail through center of ball. Apply craft glue to last strand to prevent unraveling. Arrange balls in basket.

Get festive with this Retro Christmas Crochet Ornament Garland! This crochet Christmas decoration will give a sense of homemade charm to your holiday decorations this year. The ornaments on this garland are lovely in a quaint sort of way, and they'll definitely add a fun element to your Christmas tree. Change up the colors of the ornaments to make the garland truly stand out in your home. This versatile crochet garland can either wrap around your tree or hang from the mantelpiece.



Skill level: Easy

Crochet Hook:6.0 mm

Yarn Weight(4)Weight/Worsted Weight and Aran (16-20 stitches to 4 inches)

Materials List

- Worsted Weight Yarn (Shown here: INSCRAFT Soft Yarn in Teal, Turquoise, White, Seafoam, and Really Red)
- Size I (6.0 mm) Crochet Hook
- Wooden Beads (Shown here: 1/2 inch, 3/4 inch, and 1 inch beads)
- Gloss Craft Paint
- Yarn Needle


I made three different styles of ornaments for my garland. Each has it's own pattern below, but before you start crocheting, you need to paint the wooden beads the color of your choice. I used white and aqua colored beads.

Ornament 1 Pattern

Christmas Crochet

Special Stitches:

Half-Treble Crochet (htrc) – Yarn over twice, insert hook into work, yarn over (four loops on hook), yarn over and draw through two loops (three loops on hook), yarn over and draw through all loops.




Round 1: Start with a magic loop, ch 3 and work 11 dc in the magic loop. Pull tail to tighten circle, slip stitch to join. Finish off weave in ends.

Round 2: Join new color, ch 1, (sc, ch 2, trc, ch 2, sc) all in same stitch, *2 hdc in next st, (dc, htrc) in next st, 3 trc in next st, (htrc, dc) in next st, 2 hdc in next st,** (sc, ch 2, trc, ch 2, sc) all in next st, repeat from * to **, sl st to join.

Finish off and weave in ends.

Next we will attach a little tassel to the bottom of the ornament.

Start by wrapping the yarn around your fingers four or five times. Cut off a length of yarn, thread through the top of the loops you just made and double knot it. Cut through the bottom of the loops. Use the yarn needle to thread a bead or two onto the top of the tassel. Tie onto the bottom of the ornament and cut off excess.

Ornament 2 Pattern

For this ornament, you will crochet three circles and stitch them together.

Circle 1

Round 1: Start with magic loop, ch 3, 11 dc in magic loop, pull to tighten, sl st to join.

Round 2: Ch 3, dc in same st, 2 dc in each st around, sl st to join. Finish off, weave in ends.

Circle 2

Round 1: Start with magic loop, ch 3, 11 dc in magic loop, pull to tighten, sl st to join.

Round 2: Ch 1, sc in same st, sc, 2 sc, * sc, sc, 2 sc, repeat from * twice, sl st to join.

Do not finish off.

Using the same yarn, crochet through the bottom two stitches of circle one.

When the two circles are securely attached, finish off and weave in ends.



Circle 3

Round 1: Start with magic loop, ch 3, 11 dc in magic loop, pull to tighten, sl st

to join. Stitch through bottom two stitches of Circle 2. Finish off, weave in ends.

Round 1: Start with magic loop, ch 3, 11 dc in magic loop, pull to tighten, sl st to join.


Round 2: Ch 3, dc in same st, 2 dc in each st around, sl st to join. Finish off, weave in ends.

Round 3: Join new color, ch 1, sc in same st, sc in each of next 6 stitches, hdc, (hdc, dc), (htrc, trc, htrc), (dc, hdc), hdc, sc in each of next 7 sts, hdc, (hdc, dc), (htrc, trc, htrc), (dc, hdc), hdc, sl st to join. Finish off, weave in ends.



I added a tassel to the bottom of this ornament as well following the same process used for ornament one.

When you have a little pile of ornaments, string them onto a length of yarn or tie them onto a long string of chains. I also added large wooden beads in between each of the ornaments on my garland. I really love the contrast of the glossy wood beads with the crochet ornaments.

"This easy beginner friendly christmas lights ornament is so simple to make! It consists of simple stitches and is so much fun for the holiday season - great for adding to a tree or decorating a present! This is an easy level crochet pattern, and the techniques you will need to know are single crochet, chain stitch, magic ring, and slip stitch. You will also need to know how to sew pieces together and work in the round."

Skill level: Easy

Crochet Hook: 6.0mm

Materials:

Yarn Weight(4) Medium Weight/Worsted Weight and Aran (16-20 stitches to 4 inches)

Tapestry needle

Polyfil stuffing

Bulb:

*Do not join rounds for the bulb, use a stitch marker to place in the last st of each round, and move up as you complete each round

Begin with chosen color and make a magic ring, Ch 1, work 6 Sc inside ring (6)

Round 2: 2 Sc in each around (12)

Round 3: Sc in each around (12)

Round 4: 2 Sc in first, Sc in next, repeat around (18)

Round 5: Sc in each around (18)

Round 6: 2 Sc in first, Sc in next 2, repeat around (24)

Rounds 7-9: Sc in each around (24)

Round 10: 2 Sc in first, Sc in next 3, repeat around (30)

Round 11: Sc in each around (30)

Round 12: Sc decrease, Sc in next 3, repeat around (24)

Round 13: Sc decrease, Sc in next 2, repeat around (18)

Round 14: Sc in each around (18)

Round 15: Sc decrease, Sc in next, repeat around, finish off, weave ends (12)

– Stuff with polyfil stuffing

Topper:

Begin with silver and make a magic ring, Ch 1, work 6 Sc inside ring, sl st to join, Ch 1 (6)

Round 2: 2 Sc in each around, sl st to join, Ch 1 (12)

Round 3: Sc in back loops only in each around, sl st to join, Ch 1 (12)

Round 3: Sc in each around, sl st to join, finish off leaving a long tail for sewing (12)

– Sew connector to bulb opening, weave all ends

Mom's Christmas Wreath Ornaments



These little crocheted Mom's Christmas Wreath Ornaments are such a quick and easy Christmas crochet project. They are reminiscent of the tatted ornaments our moms used to make for the tree, but faster and easier because they are crocheted with worsted weight yarn. They are also a great opportunity to get the kids involved, too. You crochet these adorable wreaths up and then let the kids decorate them. They are great as ornaments for hanging on your tree or to

adorn your holiday packages. And kids will enjoy making some for teachers and relatives too!

Skill level: Easy

Crochet Hook: 6.0 mm hook, 5.0 mm hook

Yarn Weight(4) Medium Weight/Worsted Weight and Aran (16-20 stitches to 4 inches)

- small amounts of worsted weight yarn
- G or H hook
- 7 mm Tinsel Pom Poms
- glue

Ch 18, make a Sl st in furthest ch from hook to form a ring.

Round 1: Ch 1 (does not count as st), beginning in same st as join *work 2 sc, work 1 sc in each of the next 2 sts, rep from * around, join — 24 sts.

Round 2: *Skip 1 st, work 4 hdc in next st, sk 1 st, Sl st in next st, rep from * around — 6 shells.

Fasten off leaving a long enough tail to create a loop to hang your ornament; weave in ends.

Finishing

Now is the fun part! Decorate your little wreaths with some festive Christmas trimmings. I used small tinsel pom poms but there is not limit to how you can decorate them. Think buttons, beads, embroidery ...

Yarns: Small amounts of double knitting/light worsted yarn in red, green and white

Crochet Hook

Yarn Needle

GAUGE:

Tension/Gauge is not necessary for this project to be perfect as long as all the blocks are approx. the same size

INSTRUCTIONS:

With red or green yarn CH 24

join with a SL ST into first CH to form a ring

Rnd 1: *Work 2 SC into next ST, work 1 SC into next 3 STS. Repeat from * until end (30 SC)

Rnd 2: *Work 2 SC into next ST, work 1 SC into next 4 STS. Repeat from * until end (36 STS)

Rnd 3 – 4: Work 1 SC into each ST until end (36 SC)

Rnd 5: working into backloops only – work 1 SC into each ST until end (36 SC)

Rnd 6: Work 1 SC into each ST until end (36 SC)

Rnd 7: *SC2tog, work 1 SC into next 4 STS. Repeat from until end (30 STS)

Rnd 8: *SC2tog, work 1 SC into next 3 STS. Repeat from until end (24 STS)

Fasten off and leave a tail of approx. 30 cm. (enough to close up wreath and to make a hanging chain)


Press flat as shown in photo and sew inside of wreath closed.

Thread tail through wreath and pull out at the top –

insert hook into one of the exposed loops and chain approx 20 stitches, SL ST into same loop, fasten off and weave in end.



With white yarn, insert hook into next exposed loop and work 1 SC, 1 DC, 1 SC into loop, SL ST into next loop.

*Work 1 SC, 1 DC, 1 SC into next loop, work 1 SL ST into next loop. Repeat from * all around until last loop, fasten off and weave in ends.



With red or green yarn and yarn needle – work French Knots randomly over the front of the wreath.

Christmas Bells Crocheted Wreath



Decorate your door with this Christmas Bells Crocheted Wreath. Holly leaves and white holiday bells will make your house look festive for the Christmas season. Add a big white bow at the top when you're done to give it the perfect finishing touch. This pretty wreath is easy to assemble simply use the photo as a guide and glue the crocheted clusters of holly, bells, and bows onto the wreath with a glue gun.

Skill level: Easy

Crochet Hook: 6.0 mm

Yarn Weight(4)Weight/Worsted Weight and Aran (16-20 stitches to 4 inches)

Materials:

- **Yarn:** 4 ply Solids 2.5 oz [70.9 g]; Sparkles 2 oz. [56.7 g] 1 ball makes 35 holly leaves. 1 ball of Sparkle makes 15 bells.

Color A - Dk Pine

Color B - White Tinsel

- Crochet Hook: Size 6.0 mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Gold beads 1/4 in [10 mm] diameter and Brass coated wire 0.5 m long for Bells
- 11/2 yds [1.4 m] white ribbon with gold trim 1 inch [2.5 cm] wide for big bow
- 1 yd [.9 m] of red ribbon K in [12 mm] wide for small bows
- 8 small dried pine cones
- Glue gun and glue sticks
- Grape Vine wreath 13 ins [33 cm] in diameter

Gauge: 16 sc and 16 rows = 4 ins [10 cm].

Christmas Crochet

Instructions:

BELL (Make 15)

With B, ch 2.

1st rnd: (RS). 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook. Join with ss in first sc.

2nd rnd: Ch 1. 1 sc in each sc around. Join with ss to first sc.

3rd rnd: Ch 1. 1 sc in each of first 2 sc. 2 sc in next sc. 1 sc in each of next 2 sc. 2 sc in next sc. Join with ss in first sc. 8 sc.

4th rnd: Ch 1. 1 sc in same st as last ss. (2 sc in next sc. 1 sc in next sc) 3 times. 2 sc in next sc. Join with ss in first sc. 12 sc.

5th to 7th rnds: Ch 1. 1 sc in same st as last ss. 1 sc in each sc around. Join with ss in first sc. Fasten off at end of 7th rnd.

FINISHING: Cut desired length of wire and glue bead at one end. Insert other end of wire into Bell and glue it in position as illustrated.

HOLLY LEAF (Make 15)

With A, ch 11.

1st rnd: (RS). 1 sc in 2nd ch from hook. 1 sc in next ch. (1 hdc. Ch 2. 1 hdc) all in next ch. 1 hdc in each of next 2 ch. (1 dc. Ch 2. 1 dc) all in next ch. 1 dc in next ch. 1 hdc in each of next 2 ch. (1 sc. Ch 3. 1 sc) all in last ch.

Working in other side of ch, proceed as follows: 1 hdc in each of next 2 ch. 1 dc in next ch. (1 dc. Ch 2. 1 dc) all in next ch. 1 hdc in each of next 2 ch. (1 hdc. Ch 2. 1 hdc) all in next ch. 1 sc in next ch. 1 sc in last ch. Ch 2. Join with ss to first sc. Fasten off.

ASSEMBLY

Using photo as a guide, glue Leaves, Bells and small bows in clusters as illustrated. Glue clusters on Wreath. Glue big bow at top of Wreath as illustrated. Glue pine cones onto Wreath as illustrated.

Candy Cane Crochet Wreath

This red and white crochet wreath is adorned in candy canes and looks perfectly sweet for the holiday season. This soft and plush wreath is great for indoors or out and is a fun way to celebrate the sweetness of Christmas. This is a great pattern for amigurumi fans and would be a great project for a beginner crocheter who's looking for a bit of a challenge. You could also add some glittered gum drops or sugar plums to create a wreath that's sweet and satisfying!



obtain gauge

Skill level: Intermediate

Crochet Hook: 6.0 mm

Materials:

- 4 balls of yarn in White and Red
- 1 package Chenille stems
- 12" Styrofoam wreath
- Florist U shape pins (found in the floral area most craft store usually with the Styrofoam wreaths)
- 6.0 mm crochet hook or hook needed to

Gauge: 4 hdc sts = 1", 3 rows hdc = 1"

Instructions:

Carry dropped yarn behind sts as you work.

1. With White and H hook ch-4, sl st to form a ring.
2. RND 1: Ch-1, work 2 hdc in ring, join Red, drop White, 1 hdc in ring, drop Red, pick up White, 2 hdc in ring, drop White, pick up Red, 1 hdc in ring, drop Red, pick up White, 2 hdc in ring, do not turn

3. REMAINING RNDs: (Drop White, pick up Red, hdc next st, drop Red, pick up White, hdc next 2 sts) around until piece measures 5-1\2"
4. Insert a chenille stem that has been folded in half and twisted slightly to hold tog. Fasten off Red, pick up White, hdc dec next 2 sts until opening is closed, fasten off.
5. Bend into the shape of a candy cane.
6. Continue until you have 13 candy canes.
7. Reverse color and make 5 candy canes.
8. Now you're going to crochet a ribbon to wrap around the wreath. ROW 1: With White and H hook ch-8, hdc 3rd ch from hook, hdc next 2 ch, join Red, drop White, hdc last 3 ch, ch=1, turn. (6 sts)
9. ROW 2: Hdc next 3 sts, drop Red, pick up White, hdc last 3 sts, ch-1, turn.
10. ROW 3: Hdc next 3 sts, drop White, pick up Red, hdc last 3 sts, ch-1, turn.
11. Rep row 2-3 until piece measures 137" long, fasten off.
12. Using the U shaped florist pins, pin one end of ribbon to wreath, carefully wrap the wreath with the ribbon being careful not to overlap the edges, fasten with another U pin.
13. Carefully arrange the candy canes onto the wreath holding them in place with the U pins.

MY LIL ANGEL – FREE ANGEL WINGS CROCHET PATTERN



Versatile and simple, My Lil Angel free angel wings crochet pattern is a delightful little set that can be worked up within the hour. Try this for amigurumi, baby photo props, pet costumes, or a costume for any size. Use My Lil Angel wings as

placemats for a Valentine’s dinner.

Sew them together for an adorable Premie blanket. This pattern is considered “Easy” although most

beginners fair well with it.

Yarn: 12 ply – 10 oz or less

Materials Needed: 6.0mm hook, Scissors

Dimensions:

Single strand wings average 4" wide and 8" tall

Double strand wings average 9" wide and 12" tall

Gauge – not crucial

Stitch Guide in American Terms sc-

single crochet

hdc- half double crochet

dc- double crochet

st- stitch sts-

stitches

Instruction:

Make 2

R1: Chain 20, sc 19, chain 1, turn

R2: Sc 17, chain 1, turn

R3: Sc 17, chain 1, turn

R4: Sc 15, chain 1, turn

R5: Sc 15, chain 1, turn

R6: Sc 12, chain 1, turn

R7: Sc, hdc 2, dc 7, hdc, 2 hdc in last st

Continue working around the top now, 2 dc in next st, dc 2, hdc 2, slip stitch in last & loosely slip stitch around the corner to round it off.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail to sew down the long side to give it some stiffness.

You might choose to use another yarn or embroidery thread to sew it onto amigurumi.
