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Crocheted Hats Patterns

Prayer Hat

The Prayer Hat is a super simple crochet pattern that's even easy enough for beginners to work up. This basic crocheted cap was written for charity and was originally designed to be given to cancer patients. Whether you are looking for a simple crocheted cap for yourself or would like to crochet something for charity, this simple crochet hat pattern is great pattern to work up. It's quick and easy to complete, and it's stylish, too!



Materials:

- INSCRAFT Acrylic Yarn, Color: Bubble Gum (worsted weight category 4)
- 6.0 mm Crochet Hook
- Craft Scissors
- Yarn Needle
- Stitch Marker
- 2 buttons

Head Circumference/Measurement:

Adult Ladies Size - 19 inches/48 cm - Please take note that the crochet chemo cap will stretch another 1-1.5 inches/3-4cms once placed on the head. For a larger size you can use a larger size crochet hook.

Stitches & Terms

This pattern is using U.S. stitches & terms. ch = chain

dc = double crochet

opp. = opposite

sc = single crochet

sl st = slip stitch

st = stitch

sts = stitches

rep = repeat

rnd = round

unused loops = loops at bottom of foundation chain that appear after a row of stitches has been made on the foundation row

Instructions:

Notes: This pattern is worked in continuous rounds which means that there is no joining at the end of each round. Place a stitch marker into the 1st stitch made on each round.

Starting at the Crown (top of cap)

ch 4, join into 1st ch st with a sl st to form a ring.

Rnd 1: 8 sc into the center of the ring. (8 sts)

Rnd 2: 2 sc into each st around to the end. (16 sts)

Rnd 3: * 1 sc into next st, 2 sc into next st, rep from * around to the end. (24 sts)

Rnd 4: * 1 sc into each of next 2 sts, 2 sc into next st, rep from * around to the end. (32 sts)

Rnd 5: * 1 sc into each of next 3 sts, 2 sc into next st, rep from * around to the end. (40 sts)

Rnd 6: * 1 sc into each of next 4 sts, 2 sc into next st, rep from * around to the end. (48 sts)

Rnd 7: * 1 sc into each of next 5 sts, 2 sc into next st, rep from * around to the end. (56 sts)

Rnd 8: * 1 sc into each of next 6 sts, 2 sc into next st, rep from * around to the end. (64 sts; you will now only be working with these 64 sts for the sides of the cap which means we won't be making anymore increases.)

Rnd 9: 1 sc into each st around to the end.

Tighten the center yarn tail by weaving it in with a yarn needle.

Sides of Chemo Cap

Rnds 10 - 27: 1 sc into each st around to end.

Edging and Small Front Brim

Rnd 28: 1 sl st into each of next 23 sts, 1 sc into each of next 2 sts, 1 dc into each of next 14 sts, 1 sc into each of next 2 sts, 1 sl st into each of next 23 sts.

Finish off.

Weave in yarn tail with a yarn needle.

Front Wings (Make 2)

ch 19.

Rnd 1: 1 sc into 2nd ch from hk, 1 sc into each of next 16 ch sts, 3 sc into last ch st, working on opp. side of foundation chain; 1 sc into each of next 16 unused loops, 2 sc into last unused loop, join with a sl st into 1st sc. Finish off. Weave in yarn tail with a yarn needle.

Sew one end of band onto the inside of the cap and the other end of the band onto the front of the cap above brim with a button. Do the same with the other band on the other side of cap.

Easy Floppy Hat

For fun and relaxed style this winter, crochet a comfortable floppy hat in brightly colored yarn. This easy hat crochet pattern is great for beginners, worked in rows and seamed instead of rounds.



Materials:

- Yarn: INSCRAFT Acrylic Yarn
- Crochet Hook: 6.0 mm
- Yarn needle.

Gauge: 14 sc = 4"; 13 rows = 4" in Sc Rib pattern.

Size: Head Circumference: Small (Medium) 18 (20)"

Abbreviations:

Bptr: Back post triple crochet;

ch = chain;

dc = double crochet;

Fptr: Front post triple crochet;

mm = millimeters;

P = purl;

sc = single crochet;

st(s) = stitch (es);

* = repeat whatever follows the * as indicated.

Instructions:

Ch 17.

Foundation Row: Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across – 16 sc.

Begin Sc Rib Pattern

Row 1 (WS): Ch 1, sc in front loop only of each sc across.

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in back loop only of each sc across.

Repeat Rows 1 and 2 until piece measures 18 (20)" from beginning.

Turn to work along long edge of piece.

Next Row: Ch 3 (counts as dc), dc 54 (60) sts evenly across long edge of ribbing – 55 (61) dc.

Row 1 (WS): Ch 3 (counts as dc), *Bptr in next st, dc in next st; repeat from * across.

Row 2: Ch 3 (counts as dc), *Fptr in next st, dc in next st; repeat from * across. Repeat Rows 1 and 2 until piece measures 12 (12 1/2)" from beginning.

Fasten off.

Finishing: Fold in half crosswise and sew sts of last row together for top of Hat. Sew side seam. Weave in ends.

30 Minute Newborn Beanie Hat

Free crochet baby patterns are so fast and easy to make and are great for any holiday or gift. This newborn beanie is a super simple pattern that will take you just half an hour to complete. In just one evening, you can make the cutest little multicolor hat to welcome that new bundle of joy!



From the designer: "This 30 minute crochet newborn baby beanie is perfect for any little bundle of joy! The pattern works up quick and easy, and is especially great for donations!"

Crochet Hook: 6.0 mm

Yarn Weight(4) Medium Weight/Worsted Weight and Aran (16-20 stitches to 4 inches)

Finished Size:Newborn Baby

Materials

-Worsted weight yarn -Size 6.0 mm crochet hook -Tapestry needle

Begin with a magic ring, Ch 2, 11 Dc in magic ring, sl st to join, Ch 2

Round 2: 2 Dc in each st around, sl st to join, Ch 2

Round 3: *2 Dc in first st, Dc in next st*, repeat from * around, sl st to join, Ch 2

Round 4: *2 Dc in first st, Dc in next 2 sts*, repeat from * around, sl st to join, Ch 2

Round 5-10: Dc in each st around, sl st to join, Ch 2

Round 11: Sc in each st around, sl st to join, finish off, weave ends

This beanie is so quick and easy — it will probably only take you 30 minutes to whip up!

This is also a great pattern to use for quick donation beanies. Hospitals and NICUs are always in need of handmade donated items and these take very little time to whip up!

Crochet Blankets

Puppy Dog Lovey Blanket

Puppies are known for being cute and cuddly, and this Puppy Dog Lovey Blanket is no different. Babies and toddlers will love nothing more than to curl up with this precious blanket. This crochet blanket combines sewing and crochet and the center is made of fleece fabric. Use pink yarn instead of blue if this blanket is for a girl.



Materials:

- INSCRAFT Acrylic yarn
- 6.0 mm crochet hook
- Tapestry Needle
- Poly-fil stuffing
- 2 small buttons for eyes

Abbreviations:

SC: Single Crochet

HDC: Half Double Crochet

DC: Double Crochet

Sl St: Slip Stitch

Ch: Chain

St: Stitch

Instructions:

Head (make two):

Chain 9, HDC in 2nd chain from hook, HDC across, chain 1, turn
Row 2: 2 HDC, HDC in next 6, 2 HDC in last stitch, (10 HDC), chain 1, turn
Row 3-4: HDC across (10 HDC), chain 1, turn
Row 5: HDC decrease, HDC in next 6, HDC decrease, chain 1, turn
Row 6: HDC across (8 HDC), chain 1, turn
Row 7: 2 HDC in first st, HDC in next 6, 2 HDC in last, chain 1, turn
Row 8: 2 HDC in first st, HDC in next 8, 2 HDC in last, chain 1, turn
Row 9: 2 HDC in first st, HDC in next 10, 2 HDC in last, chain 1, turn
Row 10-11: HDC across (14 HDC), chain 1, turn
Row 12: HDC decrease, HDC in next 10, HDC decrease, chain 1, turn
Row 13: HDC across (12 HDC)
Row 14: HDC decrease, HDC in next 8, HDC decrease, chain 1, turn
Row 15: HDC across (10 hdc), continue to sc around, sl st to join, fasten off,
weave in ends

Nose:

Chain 9, HDC in 2nd chain from hook, HDC across (8 HDC),
chain 1, turn Row 2: HDC across (8 HDC), chain 1, turn
Row 3: 2 HDC, HDC in next 6, 2 HDC in last, chain 1, turn
Row 4: HDC across (10 HDC), fasten off, weave in ends and sew onto one of the
head pieces.

Eye Patch:

Magic Ring, 8 DC in magic ring, join to first DC, fasten off, weave in ends and
sew on to head piece.

Sew on two small black buttons for the eyes.

Sew together head with face embellishments to solid color head. Leave a
small opening to lightly stuff with poly-fil and then sew shut. Now sew on the
ears.

Outside of Ears:

Chain 6, HDC in 2nd Chain from hook, HDC across, chain 1,
turn (5 HDC) Row 2-6: HDC across (5 HDC), chain 1, turn
Row 7: HDC decrease, HDC, HDC decrease, continue to SC around and when you
get to the top, make two HDC decrease right before Sl St to join, fasten off *Note:*
It helps to make 2 SC in each bottom corners.

Inside of Ear:

Chain 4, HDC in 2nd Ch from hook, HDC across (3 HDC), chain 1, turn

Row 2-5: HDC across (3 HDC), chain 1, turn at the end of Row 5, continue to SC around and when you get to the top, make two HDC decrease right before Sl St to join, fasten off

Note: It helps to make 2 SC in each bottom corners.

Sew the inside of the ear to the outside of the ear but be careful to sew only on the inside stitches so the yarn doesn't show through the outer ear.

Dog Paw Pattern (make 4): This would also make a great appliqué!

Magic Ring, Chain 1, 6 HDC in ring, join,
chain 1 Round 2: 2 HDC in each around
(12 HDC)

Round 3: Change color, *2 HDC, HDC, *around (18 HDC), chain 1

Round 4: *HDC and DC in same stitch, DC and HDC in next, slip stitch, *Repeat two more times, (be sure to end with a slip stitch) and continue around by making 2 SC in each stitch (18 SC), join with slip stitch to bottom of first ch 1,

Round 5: *2 DC in next 4, slip stitch to slip stitch, *Repeat two more times, fasten off.

Now make 4 more of these but without changing color (just solid)

Dog paw pads (make 12):

Magic Ring, Chain 1, 8 SC in magic ring, join to first SC, fasten off and sew onto dog paws

Now sew together dog paw with pads to solid dog paw like you did with the head. Be sure to leave a small opening to lightly stuff with poly-fil before you completely sew it shut.

To crochet around the edges you will first need a skip stitch blade to make holes around the edges. You will also need a 45mm rotary cutter handle. After you have crocheted around the edge of your blanket, sew head and paws onto the edging.

Flower Garden Crochet Blanket

"This baby blanket is made with flower motifs that are joined as you go, no sewing necessary! They are then filled in with small, green, leafy motifs in the spaces left between the flowers."



Skill level : Intermediate

Crochet Hook: 6.0 mm

Yarn Weight(4) Weight/Worsted Weight and Aran (16-20 stitches to 4 inches)

Crochet Gauge Finished Flower Motif is 6 inches across.

Finished Size Sample is 30x36 inches, can be made bigger or smaller.

Crochet Flower Motif:

Ch 6 and join to make ring

Round 1: ch 3 (counts as first dc), 15 dc, slip stitch to top of ch 3 (16 dc)

Round 2: ch 5 (first dc + ch 2), dc in same stitch, [skip 1, (dc, ch 2, dc) in next stitch] repeat around, skip last stitch, slip stitch to 3rd ch of starting ch to join (16 dc, 8 ch spaces)

Round 3: starting in the next ch 2 space, ch3, (dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in same space, sc between next 2 dc, [(2dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in next ch space, sc between next 2 dc] repeat around (32 dc, 8 sc, 8 ch 2 spaces)

*Round 4 is the final round and is the round used to join the motifs, work the first flower normally and then each flower after join the petals that are touching each other following instructions below. Each time flowers are joined together you will join them with 2 petals. See the picture above for a closer look at where the joins are made.

Round 4: slip stitch over to next ch space, 3 ch (counts as dc), 6 dc in same space, sc in next sc, [7dc in next ch space, sc in next sc], repeat around, join to first ch 3 with a slip stitch

To join flower motifs, work round 4 normally except each time you get to a petal that needs to be joined to another you will work the first 3 dc, then with the 4th dc wrap yarn around hook, insert into 4th dc of the petal you are joining to, pull up a loop, insert hook into ch space, pull up a loop, yarn over, pull through 2 loops, yarn over, pull through 3 loops, work the last 3 dc to form your petal, repeat on the next petal and as many petals as need to be joined, continue other petals as normal.

Join the flower before making the leaf motifs, add the leaves in after all 4 flowers surrounding it are connected. You will basically be using the leaves to fill in the gaps left after joining the flowers.

Crochet Leaf Motif:

ch 4, join to make a ring

Round 1: ch 1, [2 sc, ch 2] 4 times, slip stitch to first sc to join

Round 2: ch 1, sc in each sc, [slip stitch in ch space, ch 3, slip stitch to sc between to flower petals, ch 3, slip stitch in same ch space, sc in each sc] repeat around to join leaf to each of the 4 flowers surrounding it.

Once you have joined all of your flowers and filled in all of the leaf motifs you just need to weave in all of the ends and you are done with your blanket.

Miscellaneous Crochet

Cute Cuddly Owl

Make a Cute Cuddly Owl for that sweet child in your life. Amigurumi crochet patterns are so fun to make because they truly come alive when you give them a face.

Simply Soft Caron yarn is used to make this cute little guy.



Skill level: Easy

Materials:

- Simply Soft Caron Yarn: White, Purple, Yellow, and Black
- 6.0 mm Crochet hook
- Darning needle
- Poly-fill

Abbreviations:

SL = Slip Stitch

SC = Single Crochet CH = Chain

SP(s) = Spaces(s)

CC = Change Color

SC2tog = Single Crochet 2 stitches together

Instructions:



Crochet Hook: 6.0 mm

Yarn Weight: (4) Medium Weight/Worsted Weight and Aran (16-20 stitches to 4 inches)

Body: Purple

Base: Ch 3

Rnd 1: 8 SC in 1st Ch sp, SL to 1st CH made, Ch 1 turn.

Rnd 2: 2 SC in each sp around, SL to 1st SC made, CH 1, turn.

Rnd 3: *3 SC 2 SC in next sp, Rep from * around, SL to 1st Sc made, CH 1, turn.

Rnd 4: * 4 SC, 2 SC in next sp, Rep from * around, SL to 1st SC made, Ch 1, turn.

Rnd 5: * 5 SC, 2 SC in next sp, Rep from * around, SL to 1st SC made, Ch 1, turn.

Rnd 6: *6 SC, 2 SC in next sp, Rep from * around, SL to 1st SC made, Ch 1, turn.

Rnd 7: Sc around, SL to 1st SC made, Ch 1, turn.

Rnd 8: *7 SC, 2 SC in next sp, Rep from * around, SL to 1st SC made, Ch 1, turn.

Rnd 9-10: SC around, SL to 1st Sc made, CH 1, turn.

Rnd 11: 14 SC, CC to Yellow, 8 SC, CC to Purple, 14 SC, SL to 1st Sc made, Ch 1, turn.

Rnd 12: 13 SC, CC to yellow, 10 SC, CC to Purple, 13 SC, SL to 1st Sc made, Ch 1, turn.

Rnd 13-15: 12 SC, CC to Yellow, 12 SC, CC to Purple, 13 SC, SL to 1st Sc made, Ch 1, turn.

Rnd 16: 7 SC, SC2tog, 3 SC, CC to Yellow, 4 SC, SC2tog, 7 SC, CC to purple, SC2tog, 7 SC, SC2tog, SL to 1st SC made, Ch 1 turn.

Rnd 17: 6 SC, SC2tog, 2 SC, CC to yellow, 4 SC, SC2tog, 6 SC, CC to purple, Sc2tog, 6 SC, SC2tog, SL to 1st Sc made, Ch 1, turn.

Rnd 18: 5 SC, SC2tog, 2 Sc, CC to Yellow, 3 SC, Sc 2tog, 5 SC, CC to purple, Sc2tog, 4 SC, SC2tog, SL to 1st Sc made, Ch 1, turn.

Rnd 19: 4 SC, Sc2tog, 2 SC, CC to Yellow, 2 SC, Sc2tog, 4 SC, CC to purple, Sc2tog, 4 SC, SC2tog, SL to 1st Sc made, Ch 1, turn.

Head

Rnd 20: SC around, SL to 1st Sc made, Ch 1, turn.

Rnd 21: *SC, 2 SC in next sp, Rep from * around, SL to 1st Sc made, Ch 1, turn.

Rnd 22: SC around, SL to 1st Sc made, Ch 1, turn.

Rnd 23: *9 SC, 2 SC in next sp, Rep from * around, SL to 1st Sc made, Ch 1, turn.

Rnd 24-28: SC around, SL to 1st Sc made, Ch 1, turn.

Rnd 29: *9 SC, Sc2tog, Rep from * around, SL to 1st Sc made, Ch 1, turn. **Rnd 30:** Sc around, SL to 1st Sc made, Ch 1, turn.

Rnd 31: *3 SC, Sc2tog, Rep from * around, SL to 1st Sc made, Ch 1, turn.

Rnd 32: SC around, SL to 1st Sc made, Ch 1, turn.

Rnd 33: *SC, SC2tog, Rep from * around, SL to 1st Sc made, Ch 1, turn. **Rnd 34:** * Sc2tog, Rep around, SL to 1st Sc made, tie off leave long tail

Stuff with Poly-Fill

Take Tail and Weave through Rnd 34 pull tight to close and tie off and hide string.

Wings: Yellow

Base: Ch 4

Row 1: 3 SC, Ch 1, turn.

Row 2: 2 Sc in 1st sp, SC, 2 SC in last sp, Ch 1 turn.

Row 3: 5 SC, Ch 1, turn.

Row 4: 2 SC in 1st sp, 3 SC, 2 SC in last sp, Ch 1 turn.

Row 5-7: 7 SC, Ch 1 turn.

Row 8: Sc2tog, 3 SC, sc2tog, Ch 1, turn.

Row 9: 5 SC, Ch 1 turn.

Row 10: SC2tog, Sc, Sc2tog, Ch 1, turn.

Row 11: Sk 1 sp, 3 SC in next sp, SL in next sp, Tie off.

Take Purple Yarn and SC around entire motif.

Beak: orange

Base: Ch 5

Row 1: 4 Sc

Row 2: Sc2tog, Sc2tog, Ch 1, turn.

Row 3: SC2tog, Ch 1 turn.

Row 4: SL around entire motif, SL to 1st SL made, tie off hide string leave tail for sewing purposes.

Eyes: white (Make Two)

Base Ch 2

Rnd 1: 8 SC in 1st Ch sp, SL to 1st Sc made, Ch 1, turn.

Rnd 2: 2 SC in each sp around, SL to 1st Sc made, tie off and leave long tail for sewing pur



To assemble:

1st: Sew a wing to each side of the body.

2nd: Sew beak flatly onto the head

3rd: Sew eyes above beak slightly overlapping.

Bumble Bee Crochet Pattern

Don't worry; this is one bumble bee that won't sting you! This adorable Bumble Bee Crochet Pattern is an easy crochet pattern that measures 5.5 inches long when completed. Use 3 different colors of yarn and an H hook to complete this pattern.



Skill level: Easy

Crochet Hook: 6.0 mm hook

Yarn Weight: (4)Weight/Worsted Weight and Aran (16-20 stitches to 4 inches)

Materials:

- Tapestry Needle
- Polyester Stuffing
- 12mm black eyes

Body

With SC, ch 2

Round 1: sc 6 times in 2nd ch from hook (6)

Rounds 2-3: sc in each st (6)

Round 4: sc twice in each st (12)

Round 5: * sc twice in next st, sc in next st. Repeat from * 5 times (18) **Round 6:** * sc twice in next st, sc in next 2 sts. Repeat from * 5 times (24) **Round 7:** * sc twice in next st, sc in next 3 sts. Repeat from * 5 times (30) **Rounds 8-11:** With MC, sc in each st (30)

Round 12: With SC, sc in each st (30)

Round 13: * sc2tog, sc in next 3 sts. Repeat from * 5 times (24)

Round 14: * sc2tog, sc in next 2 sts. Repeat from * 5 times (18)

Fasten off with long tail.

Wings

Make 2. With AC, ch 2

Round 1: sc 6 times in 2nd ch from hook (6)

Round 2: sc twice in each st (12)

Round 3: * sc twice in next st, sc in next st. Repeat from * 5 times (18) **Rounds 4-5:** sc in each st (18)

Round 6: * sc2tog, sc next st. Repeat from * 5 times (12)

Fasten off with long tail.



Flatten wing in half, and attach one wing to each side of body.

Head

With MC, ch 2

Round 1: sc 6 times in 2nd ch from hook (6)

Round 2: sc twice in each st (12)

Round 3: * sc twice in next st, sc in next st. Repeat from * 5 times (18) **Round 4:** * sc twice in next st, sc in next 2 sts. Repeat from * 5 times (24) **Round 5:** * sc twice in next st, sc in next 3 sts. Repeat from * 5 times (30) **Rounds 6-9:** With SC, sc in each st (30)

Round 10: With MC, sc in each st (30)

Round 11: * sc2tog, sc in next 3 sts. Repeat from * 5 times (24)

Round 12: * sc2tog, sc in next 2 sts. Repeat from * 5 times (18)

Fasten off with long tail.

Antennae

Make 2. With SC, ch 2

Round 1: sc 6 times in 2nd ch from hook (6)

Rounds 2-6: sc in each st (6) Fasten off with long tail.

Eyes

Make 2. With AC, ch 2

Round 1: sc 6 times in 2nd ch from hook (6)

Round 2: sc twice in each st (12)

Round 3: sc in each st (12) Fasten off with long tail.

Fasten plastic eyes onto the crocheted eyes. To do so, insert post between desired stitches, and press washer onto back post to secure. Eyes should be fastened in the center of the crocheted eyes. Slightly stuff eyes and attach to head. Attach antennae to top of head, as pictured.



Small Evil Eye Applique

"This is the individual pattern for the Evil Eye Applique that is seen in my Easy Evil Eye Glove. The Evil Eye Glove is part of Krista Suh's "Sea of Eyes" Project. The applique can be made in any color combination using worsted weight yarn. You can easily adjust the hook size if you use a different yarn weight.



Skill Level: Easy

Crochet Hook: 6.0 mm hook

Yarn Weight(4)Weight/Worsted Weight and Aran (16-20 stitches to 4 inches)

Crochet GaugeGauge: The gauge is not important. I tend to crochet loose and my applique is

approximately 3" wide and 2 " in height.

Finished Size applique is approximately 3" wide and 2 " in height.

Materials List

- Worsted Weight Yarn in White, Black and color for eye.

Instructions

Round 1: With black yarn make a magic circle and work 6 single crochet (sc) stitches into circle. Switch to eye colored yarn in last stitch.

Round 2: 2 sc in each stitch around change to white yarn in last stitch. (12 sc total)

Round 3: *2 sc in in 1st stitch, 1 sc into the next st* Repeat * to * around. (18 sc total)

Round 4: *1 slit stitch (slst) into each of the next 2 stitches. 1 sc into the next stitch. 1 half double crochet (hdc) into the next stitch. 1 double crochet (dc) into the next stitch. Chain 2 and then dc into the same stitch. (this will create a peak). 1 hdc into the next stitch. 1 sc into the next stitch. 1 slst into each of the next 2 stitches.* Repeat * to * once more. Switch to black yarn for optional round 5.

Optional Round 5: Sc in each stitch around, including the chain spaces. 24 sc total. Leave a long tail for sewing applique onto item. Weave in ends

Meet the Traveling Tu family - PapaTu (daddy rabbit in purple), MamaTu (mommy rabbit in blue), Tutu (big brother bunny, in white) and Toto (baby sister bunny, in pink). They like to hop out of their carrot home and enjoy a nice sunny day, while munching on yummy carrots :)"

Skill level: Easy

Crochet Hook: 6.0 mm

Yarn Weight(4) Weight/Worsted Weight and Aran (16-20 stitches to 4 inches)

SUPPLIES

Crochet hooks

6 mm safety eyes

Fiberfill stuffing

White or pink embroidery

thread Yarn needle

Stitch marker

Soft Ecru (color A) Lavender (color B) Mod

Blue (color C) Hot Orange (color D) Mod

Green (color E) Warm Brown (color F)

Faded Denim (color G) Rose Petal (H)

NOTES

Please read through the entire pattern before you start.

Size information is on page 8

Use a stitch marker to mark the beginning / end of rounds

Gauge is not essential as long as you keep your tension consistent.

Please use felt or thread for the eyes if giving to babies, young children or pets as safety eyes can be a choking hazard

Alternative to magic ring: Ch 2, work 6sc (or # of sts noted in Round 1) in 2nd ch from hook. Then, continue on in rounds as noted in the pattern. Search YouTube for video tutorials.

PATTERN INSTRUCTIONS

The Tu's

Use 6.0mm hook for PapaTu (color C/blue) and MamaTu (color B/purple).

Use 6.0mm hook for TuTu (color A/white) and 2.75mm hook for Toto (color H/pink).

Ears (make 2)

Worked from top to bottom.

Work in continuous rounds, do not join or turn unless noted in pattern.

With color & hook of choice, work magic ring, ch 1 to secure ring

Round 1:

Work 6sc in magic ring (6)

Round 2:

1 sc in next 2 sts, 2 sc in next st, rep * around (8)

Round 3:

1 sc in next st, 2 sc in next st, rep * around (12)

Rounds 4-6:

1 sc in each st around (12)

Round 7: sc2tog, 1 sc in next 8 sts, sc2tog (10)

Round 8: 1 sc in each st around (10)

Round 9: sc2tog, 1 sc in next 6 sts, sc2tog (8)

Round 10: 1 sc in each st around (8)

Fasten off and leave a long tail for sewing.

Optional:

Using embroidery thread, make several vertical lines in the middle of each ear prior to sewing to the head. See photos for reference. Before sewing to the head, fold the bottom of each ear in half and secure the fold with the tail, going back and forth a few times. Then, sew the ears on top of head. Weave in any loose ends.

Arms (make 2)

Worked from bottom to top.

Work in continuous rounds, do not join or turn unless noted in pattern.

With color & hook of choice, work magic ring, ch 1 to secure ring

Round 1: Work 4sc in magic ring (4)

Rounds 2-4: 1sc in each st around (4) Fasten off and set aside for later. There is no need to stuff the arms.

Tail •

Work in continuous rounds, do not join or turn unless noted in pattern.

With color & hook of choice, work magic ring, ch 1 to secure ring.

Round 1: Work 6 sc in magic ring (6)

Round 2: 1 sc in each st around (6)

Round 3: sc 2 tog around to close.

Fasten off and leave a tail for sewing. Stuff lightly, if necessary. Attach tail on body, right above the legs.

TIP

Start working on ears, arms & tail first so you don't have to cut the yarn in the middle of working on the main body.

PATTERN INSTRUCTIONS –

The Tu's Legs → Body → Attach Arms → Head

- Worked from bottom to top

- Work in continuous rounds, do not join or turn unless noted in pattern.

Starting with the left leg...

With color & hook of choice, work magic ring, ch 1 to secure ring.

Round 1: Work 6 sc in magic ring (6)

Rounds 2-3: 1 sc in each st around (6) Fasten off here for left leg. Set aside for joining with right leg later.

Work on right leg now, starting from Round 1. We will connect the two legs at Round 4.

Round 4:

You will be going from the inside toward the outside of the right leg, then from the outside to t

he inside of the left leg.

Pick up both legs and position them so that they are facing the same direction.

Insert hook in next st of right leg as well as the next st of left leg, work 1 sc to connect them together. This 1 sc you just made will NOT count toward your stitch count. Next, work 1 sc in same st – this is your starting point so place your stitch marker here. Your next sc will be on the left leg (leg on your left side). Continuing around, working 1 sc in each st from left to right leg, making su

re to omit the connecting st mentioned earlier. (12)

Stuff with fiber fill as work progresses.

Rounds 5-8: 1 sc in each st around (12)

Have the arms ready as we will be attaching them in the next round!

Round 9:

1 sc in next 2 sts. Attach arms in next 2 sts by flattening top of arm so that 2 sts of arm aligns with next 2 sts of body. Work 1 sc in these 2 sts, stitching through both layers to secure the arm. Then, work 1 sc in next 4 sts. Next, attach the other arm the same way in the next 2 sts. Lastly, work 1 sc in last 2 sts. (12) Be sure to stuff the body. We will work on the head now.

Round 10: *1 sc in next st, 2 sc in next st*, rep * around (18)

Round 11: *1 sc in next 2 sts, 2 sc in next st*, rep * around (24)

Round 12: *1 sc in next 3 sts, 2 sc in next st*, rep * around (30)

Round 13: *1 sc in next 4 sts, 2 sc in next st*, rep * around (36)

Rounds 14-15: 1 sc in each st around (36)

Round 16: *1 sc in next 4 sts, sc2tog *, rep * around (30)

Round 17: *1 sc in next 3 sts, sc2tog *, rep * around (24)

Round 18: *1 sc in next 2 sts, sc2tog *, rep * around (18)

Round 19: *1 sc in next st, sc2tog *, rep * around (12)

Round 20: sc2tog around (6)

Fasten off and leave a long tail. Weave tail through remaining sts to close.

Place safety eyes between Rounds 14 & 15, approx. 6 sts apart. Embroider nose and/or mouth. Attach the tail if you haven't already!

PATTERN INSTRUCTIONS – Carrot House

- Worked using TWO strands of #4 worsted weight cotton yarn, held together.
- Work in continuous rounds, do not join or turn unless noted in pattern.
- Gauge: Using 2 strands of #4 yarn with J hook, 5 sts = 2 inches.
- Work stitches tightly to ensure firmness; use smaller hook if necessary.
- Worked from bottom to top (inside piece), top to bottom (outside piece).

Carrot House – Inside Piece

With color D/orange & 6.0mm hook, work magic ring, ch 1 to secure ring.

Round 1: Work 6 sc in magic ring (6)

Round 2: 2 sc in each st around (12)

Round 3: *1 sc in next st, 2 sc in next st*, rep * around (18)

Round 4: *1 sc in next 2 sts, 2 sc in next st*, rep * around (24)

Round 5: *1 sc in next 3 sts, 2 sc in next st*, rep * around (30)

Round 6: *1 sc in next 4 sts, 2 sc in next st*, rep * around (36)

Round 7: *1 sc in next 5 sts, 2 sc in next st*, rep * around, sl st in first sc to join (42)

Round 8: Ch 1. Working in BLO, 1 sc in each st around, sl st in first sc to join (42)

Round 9: Ch 1. Working in continuous rounds, 1 sc in each st around (42)

Rounds 10-18: 1 sc in each st around (42)

Round 19: *1 sc in next 5 sts, sc2tog*, rep * around (36)

Round 20: 1 sc in each st around (36)

Round 21: Sl st in each st around (36)

Fasten off and weave in ends.

Carrot House –Outside Piece

With color D/orange & 6.0mm hook, work magic ring, ch 1 to secure ring.

Rounds 1-6: Follow pattern instructions for Carrot House –Inside Piece.

Round 7: *1 sc in next 5 sts, 2 sc in next st*, rep * around (42)

Round 8: *1 sc in next 6 sts, 2 sc in next st*, rep * around (48)

Round 9: *1 sc in next 7 sts, 2 sc in next st*, rep * around (54)

Round 10: *1 sc in next 8 sts, 2 sc in next st*, rep * around (60)

See the yarn tail there?

That is what's left of the 2 large skeins of the Lily Sugar'n Cream in

Hot Orange! Each skein is 4oz / 113g / approx. 200yds. traveling to family pattern

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Rounds 11-14: 1 sc in each st around (60)

Round 15: *1 sc in next 28 sts, sc2tog*, rep * around (58)

Round 16: 1 sc in each st around (58)

Round 17: *1 sc in next 27 sts, sc2tog*, rep * around (56)

Round 18: 1 sc in each st around (56)

Round 19: *1 sc in next 26 sts, sc2tog*, rep * around (54)

Round 20: 1 sc in each st around (54)

Round 21: *1 sc in next 25 sts, sc2tog*, rep * around (52)

Round 22: 1 sc in each st around (52)

Round 23: *1 sc in next 24 sts, sc2tog*, rep * around (50)

Round 24: 1 sc in each st around (50)

Round 25: *1 sc in next 23 sts, sc2tog*, rep * around (48)

Round 26: *1 sc in next 22 sts, sc2tog*, rep * around (46)

Round 27: *1 sc in next 21 sts, sc2tog*, rep * around (44)

Rounds 28-31: 1 sc in each st around (44)

Round 32: Sl st in each st around (44)

Fasten off and weave in ends.

Carrot House –Greens

With color E/green & 6.0mm hook, ch 8.

Row 1: Work 2 sc in 2nd ch from hook and in next st, 1 sc in next 4 sts, sl st in last st (9)

Do not fasten off or turn, just continue making chains until you achieve the desired look.

Row 2: Ch 7, work 2 sc in 2nd ch from hook and in next st, 1 sc in next 3 sts, sl st in last st.

Next, sl st into the first st in the initial chain in Row 1 (8)

Row 3: Ch 9, work 2 sc in 2nd ch from hook and in next st, 1 sc in next 2 sts, sl st in last st.

Next, sl st into the first st in the initial chain in Row 1 (7)

Repeat the above steps 8 or more times. I made 3 of the little green bunches on the photo below (approx. 25 of the curly sections) and sewed them together on top of the carrot house. Fasten off, leave a long tail for sewing and weave in end.

Lamb Baby Mobile Free Crochet Pattern

A DIY baby mobile offers a great project idea to prepare for the arrival of a little one. This crochet amigurumi pattern features multicolored, fluffy lambs that you can hang from string to delight your baby from above. The lambs look great hanging beneath clouds, giving off a great soft vibe for your baby. However, the plushness of the furry yarn makes this a good option for a stuffed animal also. This pattern may take a while to complete, so this free crochet pattern will be a fun challenge. Even better, this is a great gender neutral baby shower gift because of its universal cuteness.



Skill level: Intermediate

Crochet Hook: 6.0mm

Yarn Weight(4)Weight/Worsted Weight and Aran (16-20 stitches to 4 inches)

Finished Size5 inches

Materials List

- Worsted weight yarn in cream, brown, gray or any color of your choice
- yarn (Bernat Pipsqueak in Whitey White shown here)
- 6.0 mm crochet hook
- Tapestry needle
- Small safety eyes
- Stitch marker

- Poly-fil stuffing

Abbreviations:

Magic Ring Tutorial

SC = Single Crochet

SC Decrease = Single Crochet Decrease

Head:

With worsted weight yarn..

Magic Ring, chain 1, SC 8 inside ring, do not join, continue to SC in rounds (use stitch marker to mark your rounds)

Round 2: 2 SC in each stitch around (16 SC)

Round 3: 2 SC in first stitch, SC in next, repeat around (24 SC)

Round 4-8: SC in each stitch around (24 SC)

Round 9: SC decrease, SC in next, repeat around (you should now have 16 SC)

Change to furry yarn...

Round 10: SC in each stitch around (16 SC)

Round 11: SC decrease until closed. Be sure to stuff and add safety eyes before fully closing!!

Ears:

Chain 4, SC in second chain from hook, SC in next 2.

Now working on other side of chain, SC in next 3, do not join, continue to SC in rounds

Round 2-4: SC in each stitch around (6 SC)

Round 5: SC decrease or stitch closed. Sew onto head where furry yarn meets worsted yarn.

Body:

NOTE: Body is worked with furry yarn. It is pretty much impossible to keep track of your stitches with this yarn. Do the best you can. If you are off by one or more stitches, that is ok. You won't be able to see the flaws!

With furry yarn...

Magic ring, chain 1, 8 SC in ring, do not join, continue to SC in rounds. Use stitch marker to mark your rounds.

Round 2: 2 SC in each stitch around (16 SC)

Round 3-6: SC in each stitch around (16 SC)

Round 7: SC decrease in first, SC in next

Stuff with poly-fil

Round 8: SC decrease until closed

Leave tail to sew onto head.

Feet:

Magic Ring, chain 1 in ring, make 10 SC in ring, continue to SC in rounds.

Round 2: In back loops only, SC in each stitch around (10 SC)
Round 3-4: Working in both loops, SC in each stitch around (10 SC)
Round 5: SC decrease, SC in next 3 stitches, repeat around
Round 6: SC decrease, SC in next 2, repeat around
Stuff and sew onto body.

Rainbow Easy Crochet Baby Booties



Your little one will definitely be over the rainbow excited for these Rainbow Easy Crochet Baby Booties, and the painless free crochet pattern won't make you feel too shabby either! A crochet baby shoes pattern nearly always looks adorable, but the delightful striped colors really set this design apart.

Simply by using a different size hook, you can adjust the size to fit your newborn, baby, or young toddler at any stage. The little drawstring

laces at the front will also make sure that your baby won't slip out of these shoes, while still looking adorable if you decide to tie the strings off in a bow on the front.

Skill level: Easy

Crochet Hook: 6.0 mm

Yarn Weight(4) Weight/Worsted Weight and Aran (16-20 stitches to 4 inches)

Finished Size 3 to 18 months

Materials List

- Crochet Hooks (Used F, H, and J for different sizes)
- Worsted weight yarn (White, Scarlett, Terracotta, Mustard, Fern, and Dusty Purple. Blue is Loops & Threads Impeccable in Aqua)
- Tapestry needle

Abbreviations:

Magic Ring Tutorial

SC = Single Crochet

HDC = Half Double Crochet

DC = Double Crochet



Rainbow Baby Booties Pattern:

Starting with white

Chain 10, SC in 2nd chain from hook, SC in next 7, make 5 SC in the last chain

Now working on opposite side, SC 9, join, ch 1

Round 2: HDC, 2 HDC, HDC in next 6, 2 HDC in next 2, HDC in next 2, 2 HDC in next 2, HDC in next 6, 2 HDC, HDC in last, join, ch 1.

Round 3: SC 10, 2 SC in next 2, 2 HDC in next 4, 2 SC in next 2, SC in next 10, join, ch 1.

Round 4: In back loops only, SC around, join, ch 1. (36 SC)

Change to red

Round 5: Now working in both loops, SC around, join, ch 1. (36 SC)

Change to orange

Round 6: SC in each stitch around, join, ch 1 (36 sc)

Change to yellow

Round 7: SC in each stitch around, join, ch 1 (36 sc)

Change to green

Round 8: SC in first 12, [SC decrease, SC in next] 4 times, SC in last 12, join, ch 1. (32 sc)

Change to blue

Round 9: SC in first 10, [SC decrease, SC in next] 4 times, SC in last 10, join, ch 1. (28 sc)

Change to purple

Round 10: SC in first 8, [SC decrease, SC in next] 4 times, SC in last 8, join, ch 1. (24 sc)

Change to white

Round 11: SC in first 6, [SC decrease, SC in next] 4 times, SC in last 6, join, ch 1. (20 sc)

Round 12: SC in each stitch around, join (20 sc)

Fasten off and weave in ends.

Weave strand of white yarn between round 11 and 12. Tie in a bow in the front. This can be used to tighten booties onto little feet
