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Hat Patterns

Petals Newborn Hat



The cluster stitch is used in this free crochet pattern. Start out by making a magic ring and turn the flower into a beautiful hat for a newborn. This adorable little hat will not only keep your baby warm but also stylish as well. Both of those things are big concerns for newborns! This feminine hat is perfect for any baby girl in your life or someone else's if you'd like to give it as a cute baby shower gift. It's an easy crochet pattern to complete using worsted weight yarn in any color yarn you want. It's so easy that you'll want to make one in every color of the rainbow!

Materials:

- Worsted Weight Yarn, Heavy
 - Model is stitched with a small ball of INSCRAFT Acrylic Yarn
- Small Amount Yarn in Second Color
- Crochet Hook: 6.0 mm
- Yarn Needle

Skill level: Easy

Instructions:

Round 1: Magic Ring. Ch 5, sl st. *Ch 2, dc, ch 2, sl st. Repeat from *4 times. Ch 2, sl st in 3rd ch of original ch 5. Pull ring tight, but not closed.

Round 2: *ch 4, sc on dc. Repeat from * 4 times. Ch 4, sc in top of petal from last row. Sl st to first ch.

Round 3: In ch-4 space, *2 sc, ch 1, dc, ch 1, 2sc. Ch 1. Repeat from * in each ch-4 space. Sl st in first sc.



Round 4: Ch 5, sc in first dc. *Ch 2, dc in ch-1 space (over petal-tip), ch 2, sc in dc. Repeat from * 4 times. Sl st in third ch from ch 5.


Round 5: *Work a cluster in ch-2 space. Ch 1. Repeat from * around. Sl st to first sl st.

Round 6: Ch 4, sl st in dc. *Ch 2, sl st in dc. Repeat from * around. After the last dc, ch 1, sl st to 3rd ch of initial ch 4.

Round 7: Ch 5, sl st in first ch-2 sp. Ch1. * Work a cluster in ch -2 space. Ch 1. Repeat from * around. Sl st in last ch-1 sp, ch 2, sl st in 3rd ch of original ch 5.

Round 8: *Ch 2, sl st in dc. Repeat from * around (end in the first dc).

Rounds 9 – 11: Repeat Rounds 5-7. Finish off, weave in ends.



Flower:

Round 1: Magic Ring. *Ch 3, sl st. Repeat from * 5 times. Tighten ring but leave a dime-sized opening.

Round 2: In each ch-3 space, sl st, ch 2, 2dc, ch 2, sl st. Finish off with a long end for sewing.

Round 3: With another color, attach yarn with a sl st to Magic Ring underneath a ch-3 space. Ch 3, sl st underneath next ch-3 space. Repeat around.

Round 4: In each newly-created ch-3 space, sl st,

ch 3, 3 treble crochet, ch 3, sl st. Finish off, weave in ends, except for one of the hat color.

Sew flower to hat. Weave in end.

Wrapped with Love Crochet Hat



The delightfully easy Wrapped with Love Crochet Hat pattern is the perfect gift to make for anyone in your family. This pattern comes in multiple sizes, from newborn through adult, so if you're scrambling for something that's thoughtful, this is perfect. This pattern is easy to work and features a crochet bow pattern tutorial, for you to attach to your hat later. This crochet beanie looks striking in gray and a deep purple, as shown, but it can be made in any color for a stunning look. And though this pattern comes with a how-to on the bow, you can easily skip it and just have a striped crochet hat.

Notes:

- Hat can be started with a Magic Ring or with the instructions given in Round 1
- Starting chain does not count as a stitch
- Each round is started in the same stitch as your starting chain
- The end of each round is joined by slip stitching in the first hdc of the round, not the starting chain
- Instructions for the bow can be found at the end of the file

Skill level: Easy

Crochet Hook: 6.0 mm hook

Yarn Weight(4) Medium Weight/Worsted Weight and Aran (16-20 stitches to 4 inches)

Crochet Gauge 14 stitches and 11 rows = 4" (10 cm) in hdc

Finished Size: Newborn, 0-3 Months, 3-6 Months, 6-12 Months, Toddler, Child, Teen/Small Adult, Medium Adult, Large Adult

Materials List

- Worsted weight yarn in Main Color (MC) and Accent Color (AC)
- 6.0 mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain the gauge

- yarn needle for weaving in ends

Quick Crochet Flower Hat

Pattern

Base Hat

1. **Newborn** • Head Circumference = 13" - 15" • Hat Circumference = 13" • Hat Height = 5.25"

Round 1: With MC - Ch 2, make 8 hdc in the 2nd chain from hook, sl st to join in first hdc (8)

Round 2: Ch 1, make 2 hdc in each stitch around, join (16)

Round 3: Ch 1, *hdc in first stitch, make 2 hdc in next stitch* repeat around, join (24)

Round 4: Ch 1, *hdc in first 2 stitches, make 2 hdc in next stitch* repeat around, join (32)

Round 5: Ch 1, *hdc in first 3 stitches, make 2 hdc in next stitch* repeat around, join (40)

Round 6: Ch 1, *hdc in first 7 stitches, make 2 hdc in next stitch* repeat around, join (45)

Round 7 - 9: Ch 1, hdc in each stitch around, join (45)

Round 10 - 11: With AC - Ch 1, hdc in each stitch around, join (45)

Round 12 - 14: With MC - Ch 1, hdc in each stitch around, join (45)

Round 15: Ch 1, sc in each stitch around, join (45) - Fasten off and weave in ends. Attach the bow.

2. **0 - 3 Months** • Head Circumference = 14" - 16" • Hat Circumference = 14" • Hat Height = 5.75"

Round 1: With MC - Ch 2, make 8 hdc in the 2nd chain from hook, sl st to join in first hdc (8)

Round 2: Ch 1, make 2 hdc in each stitch around, join (16)

Round 3: Ch 1, *hdc in first stitch, make 2 hdc in next stitch* repeat around, join (24)

Round 4: Ch 1, *hdc in first 2 stitches, make 2 hdc in next stitch* repeat around, join (32)

Round 5: Ch 1, *hdc in first 3 stitches, make 2 hdc in next stitch* repeat around, join (40)

Round 6: Ch 1, *hdc in first 4 stitches, make 2 hdc in next stitch* repeat around, join (48)

Round 7 - 10: Ch 1, hdc in each stitch around, join (48)

Round 11 - 12: With AC - Ch 1, hdc in each stitch around, join (48)

Round 13 - 15: With MC - Ch 1, hdc in each stitch around, join (48)

Round 16: Ch 1, sc in each stitch around, join (48) - Fasten off and weave in ends. Attach the bow.

3. **3 - 6 Months** • Head Circumference = 15" - 17" • Hat Circumference = 15" • Hat Height = 6.5"

Round 1: With MC - Ch 2, make 8 hdc in the 2nd chain from hook, sl st to join in first hdc (8)

Round 2: Ch 1, make 2 hdc in each stitch around, join (16)

Round 3: Ch 1, *hdc in first stitch, make 2 hdc in next stitch* repeat around, join (24)
Round 4: Ch 1, *hdc in first 2 stitches, make 2 hdc in next stitch* repeat around, join (32)
Round 5: Ch 1, *hdc in first 3 stitches, make 2 hdc in next stitch* repeat around, join (40)
Round 6: Ch 1, *hdc in first 4 stitches, make 2 hdc in next stitch* repeat around, join (48)
Round 7: Ch 1, *hdc in first 11 stitches, make 2 hdc in next stitch* repeat around, join (52)
Round 8 - 12: Ch 1, hdc in each stitch around, join (52)
Round 13 - 14: With AC - Ch 1, hdc in each stitch around, join (52)
Round 15 - 17: With MC - Ch 1, hdc in each stitch around, join (52)
Round 18: Ch 1, sc in each stitch around, join (52) - Fasten off and weave in ends. Attach the bow.

4. 6 - 12 Months • Head Circumference = 16" - 18" • Hat Circumference = 16" • Hat Height = 6.75"

Round 1: With MC - Ch 2, make 8 hdc in the 2nd chain from hook, sl st to join in first hdc (8)
Round 2: Ch 1, make 2 hdc in each stitch around, join (16)
Round 3: Ch 1, *hdc in first stitch, make 2 hdc in next stitch* repeat around, join (24)
Round 4: Ch 1, *hdc in first 2 stitches, make 2 hdc in next stitch* repeat around, join (32)
Round 5: Ch 1, *hdc in first 3 stitches, make 2 hdc in next stitch* repeat around, join (40)
Round 6: Ch 1, *hdc in first 4 stitches, make 2 hdc in next stitch* repeat around, join (48)
Round 7: Ch 1, *hdc in first 5 stitches, make 2 hdc in next stitch* repeat around, join (56)
Round 8 - 13: Ch 1, hdc in each stitch around, join (56)
Round 14 - 15: With AC - Ch 1, hdc in each stitch around, join (56)
Round 16 - 18: With MC - Ch 1, hdc in each stitch around, join (56)
Round 19: Ch 1, sc in each stitch around, join (56) - Fasten off and weave in ends. Attach the bow.

5. Toddler & Small Child (Approximately 1 to 5 years - please measure for a more accurate fit) • Head Circumference = 17.5" - 19" • Hat Circumference = 17.25" • Hat Height = 7.5"

Round 1: With MC - Ch 2, make 8 hdc in the 2nd chain from hook, sl st to join in first hdc (8)
Round 2: Ch 1, make 2 hdc in each stitch around, join (16)
Round 3: Ch 1, *hdc in first stitch, make 2 hdc in next stitch* repeat around, join (24)
Round 4: Ch 1, *hdc in first 2 stitches, make 2 hdc in next stitch* repeat around, join (32)
Round 5: Ch 1, *hdc in first 3 stitches, make 2 hdc in next stitch* repeat around, join (40)
Round 6: Ch 1, *hdc in first 4 stitches, make 2 hdc in next stitch* repeat around, join (48)
Round 7: Ch 1, *hdc in first 5 stitches, make 2 hdc in next stitch* repeat around, join (56)
Round 8: Ch 1, *hdc in first 13 stitches, make 2 hdc in next stitch* repeat around, join (60)
Round 9 - 15: Ch 1, hdc in each stitch around, join (60)
Round 16 - 17: With AC - Ch 1, hdc in each stitch around, join (60)
Round 18 - 20: With MC - Ch 1, hdc in each stitch around, join (60)

Round 21: Ch 1, sc in each stitch around, join (60) - Fasten off and weave in ends. Attach the bow.

Child (Approximately 5 to 10 years - please measure for a more accurate fit)

- Head Circumference = 19" - 20.5" • Hat Circumference = 18.25" • Hat Height = 7.75"

Round 1: With MC - Ch 2, make 8 hdc in the 2nd chain from hook, sl st to join in first hdc (8)

Round 2: Ch 1, make 2 hdc in each stitch around, join (16)

Round 3: Ch 1, *hdc in first stitch, make 2 hdc in next stitch* repeat around, join (24)

Round 4: Ch 1, *hdc in first 2 stitches, make 2 hdc in next stitch* repeat around, join (32)

Round 5: Ch 1, *hdc in first 3 stitches, make 2 hdc in next stitch* repeat around, join (40)

Round 6: Ch 1, *hdc in first 4 stitches, make 2 hdc in next stitch* repeat around, join (48)

Round 7: Ch 1, *hdc in first 5 stitches, make 2 hdc in next stitch* repeat around, join (56)

Round 8: Ch 1, *hdc in first 6 stitches, make 2 hdc in next stitch* repeat around, join (64)

Round 9 - 16: Ch 1, hdc in each stitch around, join (64)

Round 17 - 18: With AC - Ch 1, hdc in each stitch around, join (64)

Round 19 - 21: With MC - Ch 1, hdc in each stitch around, join (64)

Round 22: Ch 1, sc in each stitch around, join (64) - Fasten off and weave in ends. Attach the bow.

Teen / Small Adult

- Head Circumference = 21" - 22" • Hat Circumference = 19.5" • Hat Height = 8.25"

Round 1: With MC - Ch 2, make 8 hdc in the 2nd chain from hook, sl st to join in first hdc (8)

Round 2: Ch 1, make 2 hdc in each stitch around, join (16)

Round 3: Ch 1, *hdc in first stitch, make 2 hdc in next stitch* repeat around, join (24)

Round 4: Ch 1, *hdc in first 2 stitches, make 2 hdc in next stitch* repeat around, join (32)

Round 5: Ch 1, *hdc in first 3 stitches, make 2 hdc in next stitch* repeat around, join (40)

Round 6: Ch 1, *hdc in first 4 stitches, make 2 hdc in next stitch* repeat around, join (48)

Round 7: Ch 1, *hdc in first 5 stitches, make 2 hdc in next stitch* repeat around, join (56)

Round 8: Ch 1, *hdc in first 6 stitches, make 2 hdc in next stitch* repeat around, join (64)

Round 9: Ch 1, *hdc in first 15 stitches, make 2 hdc in next stitch* repeat around, join (68)

Round 10 - 17: Ch 1, hdc in each stitch around, join (68)

Round 18 - 19: With AC - Ch 1, hdc in each stitch around, join (68)

Round 20 - 22: With MC - Ch 1, hdc in each stitch around, join (68)

Round 23: Ch 1, sc in each stitch around, join (68) - Fasten off and weave in ends. Attach the bow.

Teen / Small Adult • Head Circumference = 21" - 22" • Hat Circumference = 19.5" • Hat Height = 8.25"

Round 1: With MC - Ch 2, make 8 hdc in the 2nd chain from hook, sl st to join in first hdc (8)

Round 2: Ch 1, make 2 hdc in each stitch around, join (16)

Round 3: Ch 1, *hdc in first stitch, make 2 hdc in next stitch* repeat around, join (24)

Round 4: Ch 1, *hdc in first 2 stitches, make 2 hdc in next stitch* repeat around, join (32)

Round 5: Ch 1, *hdc in first 3 stitches, make 2 hdc in next stitch* repeat around, join (40)

Round 6: Ch 1, *hdc in first 4 stitches, make 2 hdc in next stitch* repeat around, join (48)

Round 7: Ch 1, *hdc in first 5 stitches, make 2 hdc in next stitch* repeat around, join (56)

Round 8: Ch 1, *hdc in first 6 stitches, make 2 hdc in next stitch* repeat around, join (64)

Round 9: Ch 1, *hdc in first 15 stitches, make 2 hdc in next stitch* repeat around, join (68)

Round 10 - 17: Ch 1, hdc in each stitch around, join (68)

Round 18 - 19: With AC - Ch 1, hdc in each stitch around, join (68)

Round 20 - 22: With MC - Ch 1, hdc in each stitch around, join (68)

Round 23: Ch 1, sc in each stitch around, join (68) - Fasten off and weave in ends. Attach the bow.

Large Adult • Head Circumference = 23" - 24" • Hat Circumference = 21.75" • Hat Height = 9"

Round 1: With MC - Ch 2, make 8 hdc in the 2nd chain from hook, sl st to join in first hdc (8)

Round 2: Ch 1, make 2 hdc in each stitch around, join (16)

Round 3: Ch 1, *hdc in first stitch, make 2 hdc in next stitch* repeat around, join (24)

Round 4: Ch 1, *hdc in first 2 stitches, make 2 hdc in next stitch* repeat around, join (32)

Round 5: Ch 1, *hdc in first 3 stitches, make 2 hdc in next stitch* repeat around, join (40)

Round 6: Ch 1, *hdc in first 4 stitches, make 2 hdc in next stitch* repeat around, join (48)

Round 7: Ch 1, *hdc in first 5 stitches, make 2 hdc in next stitch* repeat around, join (56)

Round 8: Ch 1, *hdc in first 6 stitches, make 2 hdc in next stitch* repeat around, join (64)

Round 9: Ch 1, *hdc in first 7 stitches, make 2 hdc in next stitch* repeat around, join (72)

Round 10: Ch 1, *hdc in first 17 stitches, make 2 hdc in next stitch* repeat around, join (76)

Round 11 - 19: Ch 1, hdc in each stitch around, join (76)

Round 20 - 21: With AC - Ch 1, hdc in each stitch around, join (76)

Round 22 - 24: With MC - Ch 1, hdc in each stitch around, join (76)

Round 25: Ch 1, sc in each stitch around, join (76) - Fasten off and weave in ends. Attach the bow.

Bow Pattern

For Baby and Toddler sizes:

Round 1: With AC - Ch 23, hdc in 2nd chain from hook and in each stitch across, sl st in first hdc to form a circle (22)

Round 2 - 4: Ch 1, hdc in each stitch around, join (22)

Fasten off, leaving a lengthy tail. Use the tail to wrap the center of the bow. Secure the end and use it for attaching to the hat along the accent colored stripe.


For Child and Adult sizes:

Round 1: With AC - Ch 26, hdc in 2nd chain from hook and in each stitch across, sl st in first hdc to form a circle (25)

Round 2 - 5: Ch 1, hdc in each stitch around, join (25)

Fasten off, leaving a lengthy tail. Use the tail to wrap the center of the bow. Secure the end and use it for attaching to the hat along the accent colored stripe.

Dual Color Crochet Hat

Fingering or sport weight yarn is used to make this Dual Color Crochet Hat. A free crochet pattern like this one is worked in rounds and can be done in just one night. Beanies like this can be hard to find, so you have to hold on to the great ones. The best part is that this is definitely a unisex pattern, so you can work up crochet gifts for everyone in the family if you really want to! With an easy pattern like this one, there's no reason not to take advantage of having the best homemade winter accessories.



Materials:

- Fingering/Sport Weight Yarn
 - Approximately 110 yards of color A and 85 yards of color B
 - Model is stitched with Blue Sky Alpaca/Silk Slate and Berroco Softwist Kale
- Crochet Hook: 6.0 mm
- Stitch Marker

Skill level: Intermediate

Size:

7 ¼" high and 24" circumference (hat will be a bit loose for smaller heads; if you want it a bit smaller, use a hook the next size smaller)

Gauge:

16 sc and 19 rows = 4"

Notes:

Hat is worked in rounds. Ch 1 at beginning of round does not count as first stitch of round; other chs do count as one stitch in increase rounds. When round instructions indicate one color, continue working in that color until pattern notes to change.

Instructions:

Round 1: With color A, ch 2 loosely. Work 8 sc in first ch. Join with sl st to first sc, ch 1.

Round 2: Work 2 hdc in each sc around. Join with sl st to first sc, ch 1. (16 sts)

Round 3: Hdc in first stitch, 2 hdc in next stitch. *Hdc in next stitch, 2 hdc in next stitch. Repeat from * around. Join with sl st to first sc, ch 1. (24 sts)

Round 4: *Hdc, ch 1, skip next st, [hdc, ch 1] in next stitch. Repeat from * around. Join with sl st to first sc, ch 1. (32 sts)

Round 5: With color B, *Sc in hdc, dc in hdc one row below (over chain). Repeat from * around. Join with sl st to first sc, ch 1. (32 sts)

Round 6: With color A, *hdc in next 3 sts, 2 hdc in next stitch. Repeat from * around. Join with sl st to first sc, ch 1. (40 sts)

Round 7: With color B, *[hdc, ch 1, skip next st] twice, [hdc, ch 1] in next stitch. Repeat from * around. Join with sl st to first sc, ch 1. (48 sts)

Round 8: With color A, *Sc in hdc, dc in hdc one row below (over chain). Repeat from * around. Join with sl st to first sc, ch 1. (48 sts)

Round 9: With color B, *hdc in next 5 sts, 2 hdc in next stitch. Repeat from * around. Join with sl st to first sc, ch 1. (56 sts)

Round 10: *[hdc, ch 1, skip next st] 3 times, [hdc, ch 1] in next stitch. Repeat from * around. Join with sl st to first sc, ch 1. (64 sts)

Round 11: With color A, *Sc in hdc, dc in hdc one row below (over chain). Repeat from * around. Join with sl st to first sc, ch 1. (64 sts)

Round 12: *Hdc in next 7 sts, 2 hdc in next stitch. Repeat from * around. Join with sl st to first sc, ch 1. (72 sts)

Round 13: *Hdc in next 8 sts, 2 hdc in next stitch. Repeat from * around. Join with sl st to first sc, ch 1. (80 sts)

Round 14: With color B, *Hdc, ch 1, skip next stitch. Repeat from * around. Join with sl st to first sc, ch 1. (80 sts)

Round 15: With color A, *[sc in hdc, dc in hdc one row below (over chain)] 4 times, sc in next stitch, 2 dc in hdc one row below. Repeat from * around. Join with sl st to first sc, ch 1. (88 sts)

Round 16: With color B, hdc in each stitch around. (88 sts)

Round 17: With color A, *hdc in next 10 sts, 2 hdc in next stitch (96 sts).

Round 18: With color B, *hdc in next stitch, ch 1, skip next stitch. Repeat from * around. Join with sl st to first sc, ch 1.

Round 19: With color A, *Sc in hdc, dc in hdc one row below (over chain). Repeat from * around. Join with sl st to first sc, ch 1.

Round 20: With color A, *hdc in next stitch, ch 1, skip next stitch. Repeat from * around. Join with sl st to first sc, ch 1.

Round 21: With color B, *Sc in hdc, dc in hdc one row below (over chain). Repeat from * around. Join with sl st to first sc, ch 1.

Rounds 22-25: Repeat rounds 18-21.
Round 26: With color A, repeat round 18.
Round 27: With color B, repeat round 19.
Rounds 28-31: Repeat rounds 26 and 27 twice.
Round 32: With color A, sc in each stitch around.
Round 33: With color B, sc in each stitch around.
Round 34: Repeat round 32. Fasten off and weave in ends.





Ice Queen Cap

Work up this Ice Queen Cap just in time for the cold winter months. Using just one ball of traditional worsted weight yarn in any yarn color of your choice, this crochet hat pattern is the perfect winter accessory. Any woman will truly look like royalty when she wears this trendy cap outside. A cute decorative button adds a nice finishing touch to the side of this cap. One size fits the average woman's head for this particular intermediate crochet pattern.

Materials:

- Worsted Weight Yarn
 - o Model is stitched with INSCRAFT Acrylic Yarn
 - o Main Color (MC) Dark Grey Mix
- Crochet Hook: 6.0 mm
- 2 Buttons

Skill level: Intermediate

Size:

One to fit an average woman's head.

Gauge:

14 sc and 17 rows = 4" [10 cm].

Instructions:

Note: Ch 2 at beg of rnd does not count as st.

Beg at crown, ch 3. Join with sl st to first ch to form a ring. (See diagram on page 2). **1st rnd:** Ch 3. 7 dc in ring. Join with sl st to top of ch 3. 8 dc.

2nd rnd: Ch 2. 2 dcfp around each dc around. Join with sl st to first dcfp. 16 sts.

3rd rnd: Ch 2. *1 dcfp around each of next 2 dcfp. 1 dc in sp between last dcfp and next dcfp. Rep from * around. Join with sl st to first dcfp. 24 sts.

4th rnd: Ch 2. *1 dcfp around next dcfp. 1 dc in sp between last dcfp and next dcfp. 1 dcfp around next dcfp. 1 dc in next dc. Rep from * around. Join with sl st to first dcfp. 32 sts.

5th rnd: Ch 2. *1 dcfp around next dcfp. 1 dc in next dc. 1 dcfp around next dcfp. 2 dc in next dc. Rep from * around. Join with sl st to first dcfp. 40 sts.

6th rnd: Ch 2. *1 dcfp around next dcfp. 2 dc in next dc. 1 dcfp around next dcfp. 1 dc in each of next 2 dc. Rep from * around. Join with sl st to first dcfp. 48 sts.

7th rnd: Ch 2. *1 dcfp around next dcfp. 1 dc in each of next 2 dc. 1 dcfp around next dcfp. 2 dc in next dc. 1 dc in next dc. Rep from * around. Join with sl st to first dcfp. 56 sts.

8th rnd: Ch 2. *1 dcfp around next dcfp. 2 dc in next dc. 1 dc in next dc. 1 dcfp around next dcfp. 1 dc in each of next 3 dc. Rep from * around. Join with sl st to first dcfp. 64 sts.

9th rnd: Ch 1. 1 sc in each st around. Join with sl st to first sc. 64 sc.

10th rnd: Ch 2. *3 dcfp around dcfp 2 rows below. Miss next sc. 1 dc in next sc. Miss next sc. Rep from * 15 times more. Join with sl st to first dcfp.

11th rnd: As 9th rnd.

12th rnd: Sl st in next st. Ch 3 (counts as dc). Miss next sc. 3 dcfp around dc 2 rows below. Miss next sc. *1 dc in next sc. Miss next sc. 3 dcfp around dc 2 rows below. Miss next sc. Rep from * 14 times more. Join with sl st to top of ch 3.

13th rnd: As 9th rnd.

14th rnd: Sl st in each of next 2 sts. Ch 3 (counts as dc). Miss next sc. 3 dcfp around dc 2 rows below. Miss next sc. *1 dc in next sc. Miss next sc. 3 dcfp around dc 2 rows below. Miss next sc. Rep from * 14 times more. Join with sl st to top of ch 3.

Rep 13th and 14th rnds until work from beg measures 8" [20.5 cm], ending on a 14th rnd. Do not fasten off.

Band:

1st and 2nd rnds: Ch 1. 1 sc in each st around. Join with sl st to first sc. 64 sc. Do not fasten off.

Brim: Beg working in rows

1st row: Ch 1. 1 sc in each of next 46 sc. Turn. Leave rem sc unworked.

2nd to 10th rows: Ch 1. 1 sc in each sc to end of row. Turn. Fasten off at end of last row.

FINISHING

Fold Brim of Hat at corners and sew into place with button on each side as shown in photo.

Crochet flower patterns

Flower Free Crochet Pattern



Make some fabulous flowers with this Flower Free Crochet Pattern. You can use multiple colors of yarn to have a beautiful assortment. Half double crochet and single crochet are used to make these breathtaking floral designs. They make great embellishments for a variety of other crochet patterns including hats, homemade afghans, tote bags, and more. Flowers like these also make great stashbuster projects, too. If you're looking to use up your leftover yarn, there's no better answer than these pretty little flowers.

Materials:

- Worsted Weight Yarn
- Crochet Hooks: 5.0 mm and 6.0 mm

Skill level: Easy

Notes:

1. Hook size doesn't really matter, it just depends on how big you want your flowers.
2. If it starts to curl up, just add an extra sc or 2 as you do steps 3 and 5 to make it lie flat.

Instructions:

- Step 1. With center color, start with a magic ring.
Step 2. Chain 2, make 16 hdc into the ring and join.
Step 3. Chain 1, make 1 sc in each hdc from previous round. Join.
Step 4. Finish off center color, add in outer color.
Step 5. Chain 1, make 1 sc in each sc from previous round. Join.
Step 6. *Chain 4, 1 sc in next stitch* Repeat all the way around. Join and finish.



Grandma's Magic Crocheted Flower Pattern

Embellish afghans, sweaters, shawls and more with this Grandma's Magic Crocheted Flower Pattern. You could also use these colorful flowers to create a rug or table runner, or use them as coasters or dishcloths. This pattern is great for using up leftover yarn and you can easily create something beautiful out of all your leftover yarn scraps. Though this flower may look intricate, it's actually made using very simple crochet techniques.



Materials:

- 1 skein of yarn in the color of your choice
- Crochet hook (any size will do)

Instructions:

Works is done in only five rounds. After round two, 8 petals begins with shell stitch and it repeats to end and you can use 2 colors, once for the 1 to 2 rounds, another can be use to crochet petals rounds.

1. Center ring : ch 5, sl st to first ch from hook.
2. Round 1 : To start round 1, you have to crochet ch 5, first ch 3 count as dc, other ch 2 count as ch 2. After [1 dc, ch 2]7 times, sl st to ch 3. (include first ch 3, there should be 8 dc in the ring) Do not turn.



3. Round 2 : ch 1 and 2 dc in next ch-2 space. ch 2 again, another 2 dc in that ch-2 space. ch 2, *2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc in next ch-2 space, ch 2 * repeat * to* across. sl st to first dc of the round.



4. Round 3 : in this round, 8 petals of the flower begins. ch 1, sl st to next ch-2 space, ch 2 (2 dc, ch 3, 2 dc shell stitch)in same ch-2 space, ch 3 again. *skip next ch-2 space and shell st in next ch-2 space, ch 3* repeat to end, sl st to first dc of the shell.



5. Round 4 : ch 1, sl st to ch-3 space of the shell, ch 2, *shell st in ch-3 space, ch 3, sl st to next ch-3 space, ch 3 again *repeat across, sl st to first dc of the shell.



Round 5 : ch 2 and sl st to next ch-3 space, * shell st in ch-3 space, in this round we add two more ch to ch 3, so its going with ch 5 now, sl st to the same place that sl st in previous round, ch 5 again* repeat this across, sl st to first dc of the shell st.



Crochet Hairpin Rosette

Imagine pulling a hairpin out of your coifed hairdo and proceeding to crochet a rosette with it!.....Hi! I'm Dawn from [Sew Ritzy~Titzzy](#) and while I won't pull a hairpin out of my hair, I will show you a project that involves a hairpin, crochet hook and simple sc stitches that will become a darling rosette.




Let's begin.

Pic 1: This is the hairpin frame. I actually snagged this one at the thrift store, but I know they are readily available in craft stores.


Pic 2: Make a slip knot with your yarn (I used weight 4 yarn and a G crochet hook.)

Pic 3: Slide the bottom off of the frame and place slip knot on left bar. Make sure the knot is centered. Wrap the yarn around the right hand bar and to the back. Slip bottom bar back in place. You can determine the width of your loops by the project you are doing. Mine is spaced about 3 inches.



Pic 4: (At first, it will seem very wonky to have hold the frame and make a sc. I hold the frame against my stomach to steady it. Whatever works for you.) Now take your crochet hook and slip it under the front edge of loop.

Pic 5: Yarn over and pull up loop. Pic 6. Sc 1.



Pic 7: Now take your crochet hook and turn it upside down. This seems so awkward at first, but this too will come! While holding the hook upside-down, take the frame and turn it 180 degrees. Pretend it is a book and your are turning the page. It is just like that! You should now have a 'new loop' wrapped around the right bar.

Pic 8: Slip your hook underneath the front of the loop. Yarn over and pull up loop.

Pic 9: Sc 1.

Repeat directions from pic 7-9 until you have desired no. of loops on bars.



Pic 10: You will need 24 loops on both sides of frame for this rosette.

Pic 11: Cut yarn and tie off end.

Pic 12: Cut a small amount of yarn and thread through tapestry needle. Slip off bottom bar and before slipping off the loops, thread the needle along the edge.



Pic 13: Continue to thread the edge until you reach the last loop.

Pic: 14: Carefully slide off loops.

Pic: 15: Gather thread and knot. You will see the rosette taking shape.



Pic 16: Join by tying ends together and weave ends into rosette. You can leave rosette just as it is or add a crocheted border. For a border --around outer edge, sc in each loop -- keeping loops twisted! Make 2 chs between each sc. Join to form a ring.

Pic 17: By moving hairpin bars closer together, I crocheted a smaller rosette to sew to larger rosette. And a fun button to complete it!

Daffodils Bouquet

Crochet a lasting bouquet of cheerful daffodils with this flower crochet pattern. Display in a glass vase anywhere you want a bit of color. Floral wire helps keep the flowers sturdy enough to arrange. This bouquet matches the [Daffodils Dish Cloths](#) for the kitchen.



Materials:

- Yarn: INSCRAFT Acrylic Yarn
Main Color (MC) (Hot Green)
Contrast A (Sunshine)
Contrast B (White)

- Crochet Hook: Size 6.0 mm * or size needed to obtain gauge
- Light green floral wire
- Hot glue gun.

Size: Daffodil: Approx 2½ ins [6 cm] wide.

Gauge: 15 sc and 16 rows = 4 ins [10 cm].

Instructions:

Daffodil (make 6).

With A, ch 3.

1st rnd: (RS). 6 hdc in 3rd ch from hook. Join with sl st in back loop of first hdc.

First Petal: 1st row: Ch 1. 2 sc in back loop of same sp as last sl st. Ch 1. Turn.

2nd row: Ch 1. 2 sc in each sc to end of row. 4 sc. Turn.

3rd to 5th rows: 1 sc in each sc to end of row. Ch 1. Turn.

6th row: *(Draw up a loop in each of next 2 sc. Yoh and draw through 3 loops on hook - sc2tog made) twice.* Turn.

7th row: Ch 3. Miss first sc. Sl st in next sc. Sl st in side of each of next 5 rows of petal. Sl st in last sc worked on 1st row and in back loop of next hdc. Do not turn.

Second to Sixth Petals: 1st row: Ch 1. 2 sc in back loop of same hdc as last sl st. Ch 1. Turn.

2nd to 7th rows: Work as given for 2nd to 7th rows of First Petal. At end of Sixth Petal, fasten off.

Trumpet: Join B with sl st to any front loop of 1st rnd.

1st rnd: Ch 1. 2 sc in same sp as sl st. *2 sc in next front loop of sc. Rep from * around. Join with sl st in first sc.

2nd and 3rd rnds: Ch 1. 1 sc in same sp as sl st. 1 sc in each sc around. Join with sl st in first sc. Fasten off at end of 3rd rnd.

Leaf (make 3).

With MC, ch 6.

1st row: 1 sc in 2nd ch from hook. 1 sc in each ch to end of ch. 5 sc. Turn.

2nd and 3rd rows: Ch 1. 1 sc in each sc to end of row. Turn.

4th row: Ch 1. 1 sc in each of first 2 sc. 3 sc in next sc. 1 sc in each sc to end of row. 7 sc. Turn.

5th and 6th rows: Ch 1. 1 sc in each sc to end of row. Turn.

7th row: Ch 1. 1 sc in each of first 3 sc. 3 sc in next sc. 1 sc in each sc to end of row. 9 sc. Turn.

8th and 9th rows: Ch 1. 1 sc in each sc to end of row. Turn.

10th row: Ch 1. 1 sc in each of first 4 sc. 3 sc in next sc. 1 sc in each sc to end of row. 11 sc. Turn.

11th to 14 rows: Ch 1. 1 sc in each sc to end of row. Turn.

15th row: Ch 1. Sc2tog over first 2 sts. 1 sc in each sc to last 2 sts. Sc2tog over last 2 sts. Turn.

16th to 18th rows: Ch 1. 1 sc in each sc to end of row. Turn. Rep 15th to 18th rows until 3 sts rem. Fasten off.

Stem (make 6).

Cut floral wire each 7 ins [18 cm] long. With MC, ch 27.

1st row: 1 sc in 2nd ch from hook. Align floral wire with chain made. Working over floral wire, 1 sc in each ch to end of ch. Fasten off.

Daffodil bouquet: Glue Daffodil to folded end of stem. Holding 2 stems tog, Wrap leaf around stems. Wind MC around wrapped leaf at base of bouquet. Secure yarn.

Pink Rose Bouquet

Crochet a lasting bouquet of roses in three shades of pink with this flower bouquet crochet pattern. This rose bouquet would make a beautiful centerpiece or decorative accent. This bouquet coordinates with the Rose Dishcloth and Pothead for a kitchen set.



Materials:

Yarn: INSCRAFT Acrylic Yarn

Main Color (MC)

Contrast A

Contrast B

Contrast C

- Crochet Hook: Size 6.0 mm or size needed to obtain gauge
- Light green floral wire

Size:

Full Flower: Approx 4 ins [10 cm] wide.

Flower Bud: Approx 2 ins [5 cm] long.

Gauge: 15 sc and 16 rows = 4 ins [10 cm].

Instructions:

FULL FLOWER

(Make 3 each with MC, A and B).

Ch 4, leaving a long end to use for gathering center closed when Rose is complete.

Join with sl st in first ch to form a ring.

1st rnd: Ch 1. (2 sc. 2 hdc. 2 dc. 3 tr) all in ring. Join with sl st in first sc.

2nd rnd: Working behind 1st rnd, ch 1. Sl st between first 2 sc. Ch 3. Sl st between next 2 hdc. Ch 3. Sl st between next 2 dc. Ch 3. Sl st between next 2 tr. Ch 3. Sl st after last tr. Ch 3. Join with sl st to first sc. 5 ch-3 loops.

3rd rnd: *Ch 1. (5 dc. Sl st) in next ch-3 loop. Rep from * around. Join with sl st in first ch 1. 5 petals.

4th rnd: Working behind last rnd, ch 1. 1 sc in same sp as last sl st. *Ch 5. Sl st in sp between next 2 petals. Rep from * 3 times more. Ch 5. Join with sl st in first sc. 5 ch-5 loops.

5th rnd: *Ch 1. (2 dc. 4 tr. 2 dc. Sl st) in next ch-5 loop. Rep from * around. Join with sl st in first ch 1. 5 petals.

6th rnd: Working behind last rnd, ch 1. 1 sc in same sp as last sl st. *Ch 7. Sl st in sp between next 2 petals. Rep from * 3 times more. Ch 7. Join with sl st in first sc. 5 ch-7 loops.

7th rnd: *Ch 1. (3 dc. 5 tr. 3 dc. Sl st) in next ch-7 loop. Rep from * around. Join with sl st in first ch 1. 5 petals. Fasten off.

Thread end at starting ring onto a tapestry needle and gather center tog tightly to close flower.

FLOWER BUD

(Make 2 each with MC, A and B). With C, ch 2.

1st rnd: 5 sc in 2nd ch from hook. Join with sl st in first sc.

2nd rnd: Ch 1. (2 sc in next sc. 1 sc in next sc) twice. 2 sc in last sc. Join with sl st in first sc. 8 sc.

3rd rnd: Ch 1. (2 sc in next sc. 1 sc in next sc) 4 times. Join MC, A or B with sl st in first sc. 12 sc. Break C.

4th rnd: With MC, A or B, ch 1. Working in back loop only of each sc work 1 sc in same sp as last sl st. 1 sc in each sc around. Join with sl st to first sc.

5th rnd: Ch 1. 1 sc in same sp as last sl st. *Miss next sc. 5 sc in next sc – shell made. Miss next sc. 1 sc in next sc. Rep from * twice more. Miss next sc. Shell in next sc. Miss next sc. Join with sl st in first sc.

6th rnd: Working behind last rnd, ch 1. 1 sc in same sp as last sl st. *Ch 4. Sl st in sp between next 2 petals. Rep from * once more. Ch 4. Join with sl st in first sc. 3 ch-4 loops.

7th rnd: *Ch 1. (4 dc. 1 hdc. 1 sc. Sl st) in next ch-4 loop. Rep from * twice more. Join with sl st in first ch 1. Fasten off.

STEMS (make 15). With C, ch 51.

1st row: 1 sc in 2nd ch from hook. 1 sc in each ch to end of ch. 50 sc. Fasten off.

LEAVES (make 30): With C, ch 5.

1st rnd: 1 sc in 2nd ch from hook. 1 hdc in next ch. 1 dc in next ch. 5 dc in last ch. Working into opposite side of ch into rem loops, 1 dc in next ch. 1 hdc in next ch. 1 sc in last ch. Join with sl st to first sc. Fasten off.

FINISHING

Cut floral wire in lengths to fit stems and weave through stem. Sew 2 leaves to each stem. Attach Full Flowers or Flower Buds to stem end.

Pansies Bouquet

Crochet a lasting bouquet of colorful pansies for your kitchen or anywhere else in the home. You can also crochet these pansies to adorn garments or accessories. This crochet flower bouquet matches the Pansies Potholder and Dishcloth kitchen set.



Materials: (Amounts are given for bouquet of pansies.)

INSCRAFT Acrylic Yarn

Contrast A (Soft Violet)

Contrast B (Hot Purple)

Contrast C (Cornflower Blue)

Contrast D (Sunshine)

Contrast E (Hot Green)

- Crochet Hook: Size 6.0 mm **or size needed to obtain gauge**

- Plastic pot 3½ ins [9 cm] in diameter

- Hot glue gun.

Size: Pansy: Approx 2½ ins [6 cm] wide.

Pansy Cluster: Approx 7 ins [18 cm] in diameter.

Gauge: 15 sc and 16 rows = 4 ins [10 cm].

Instructions:

Pansy

With D, ch 4. Join with sl st to form a ring. 1st rnd: Ch 1. (2 sc in ring. Ch 2) twice. (2 sc in ring. Ch 5) 3 times. Join with sl st to first sc. Break D.

2nd rnd: Join Color 2 with sl st to first ch-2 sp. Ch 2. (2 hdc. Ch 3. 1 sl st in first ch – Picot made. 2 hdc) all in same ch-2 sp. Miss next sc. Sl st in next sc. (2 hdc. Picot. 2 hdc) all in next ch-2 sp. [Miss next sc. Sl st in next sc. (1 hdc. 9 dc. 1 hdc) all in next ch-5 sp] 3 times. Miss next sc. Sl st in next sc. Join with sl st to top of ch 2. Fasten off.

Pansy Cluster

Make 3 Pansies each with A, B and C as Color 2.

Base: With E, ch 2.

1st rnd: 8 sc in 2nd ch from hook. Join with sl st in first sc.

2nd rnd: Ch 3 (counts as dc). 1 dc in same sp as sl st. 2 dc in each sc around. Join with sl st to top of ch 3. 16 dc.

3rd rnd: Ch 3 (counts as dc). 1 dc in same sp as sl st. 2 dc in each dc around. Join with sl st to top of ch 3. 32 dc.

4th rnd: Ch 1. *1 sc in each of next 4 dc. Ch 12. 1 sc in 2nd ch from hook. 1 hdc in next ch. (2 dc in next ch. 1 dc in next ch) 3 times. 2 dc in next ch. 1 hdc in next ch. 1 sc in next ch. 1 sc in each of next 4 sc. Ch 8. 1 sc in 2nd ch from hook. 1 hdc in next ch. 2 dc in next ch. 1 dc in next ch. 2 dc in next ch. 1 hdc in next ch. 1 sc in next ch. Rep from * around. Join with sl st to first sc. Fasten off. (6 long petals and 6 short petals).

FINISHING

Sew 6 Pansies around Base – one at beg of each long petal, alternating colors.

Sew rem 3 Pansies inside of Base.

Place stuffing inside of pot. Cover with Cluster of Pansies. Glue Cluster to pot if necessary.
